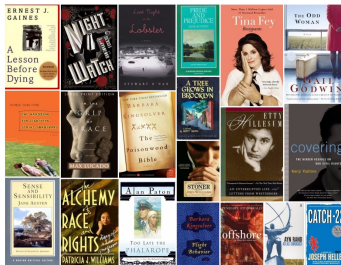


Wish Alexis Fetzer Good Luck in Boston!
