


In criminal cases, if a defendant can't afford an attorney, the government provides one for them called a "public defender"



The government funds both the prosecution and public defense. You'd think they would provide equal funding to both sides. In reality, prosecutors receive much more money.


Public Defense²

This money is converted into useful lawyer tools




- 37% of State Innates and 54% of Federal inmates spoke with their public defenders within the first week of arrest ³
- 60% of State inmates and 75% of federal inmates spoke with their private attorneys within a week of arrest ³
- About 5% of inmates with public defenders did not discuss their case with their attorney at all
- Only 1-2% of inmates with hired attorneys did not discuss their case with them at all³
- Around 26% of state inmates and 46% of federal inmates with public defenders discussed their case with their attorneys at least four times
- 58% of State and 65% of Federal inmates with private attorneys met with their attorneys four or more times about their case³
