RICHMOND COLLEGE

THE CLASS of 1938 has been making history since its entrance into college on September 8, 1934. Approximately two hundred strong, it enjoyed from the very first day the distinction of being the largest freshman class in the history of the school. Under the leadership of Roger Page, President; Russell Walton, Vice-President; Charles Crowder, Secretary; Dick Stoneburner, Treasurer; and Paul Roberts, Senator, it passed through an eventful first year, highlights of which were an extraordinarily well-executed Rat Parade, the kidnapping of two freshmen and an upperclassman when William and Mary prematurely burned the Thanksgiving bonfire, and a socially and financially successful Frosh-Soph dance.

Throughout the sophomore year the destiny of the Class of '38 was guided by Thomas Johnson, President, Hickie Wallace, Vice-President, Larry Edberg, Secretary, J. T. Arendall, Treasurer, and Dick Stoneburner, Senator. Socially, the activities of the class were climaxed by an elaborate Freshman-Sophomore dance; financially, the year left a history-making surplus in the class coffers, a surplus attributable to the profits from the dance.

The class entered its third year with Russell Walton, President, Curtis Haug, Vice-President, J. T. Arendall, Secretary, Shanks Wilborn, Treasurer, and Ralph Moore, Senator at the helm. Its principal bid for fame was the Junior Prom, perhaps the most successful formal dance ever given on this campus.

Never a group to rest on past laurels, the class of '38 moved into its senior year and leadership in all phases of undergraduate activity. Administrative duties this year were handled by Ernie Wooten, President, Larry Edberg, Vice-President, Joe Dameron, Secretary, D. W. Thornhill, Treasurer, Dick Willis, Senator. Socially, the class went rustic in presenting the traditional "Barn Dance," which was widely acclaimed.

WESTHAMPTON COLLEGE

THE FRESHMAN CLASS of Westhampton College, in 1934, elected Oliver Messer, President; Margaret Carpenter, Vice-President; Martha Ellis, Secretary; and Elsie Mitchell, Treasurer. Hoping to foster a closer relationship between dormitory and town students, the dorm girls were hostesses at a wienie roast, which was followed by invitations from the town students to a theatre party. With this beginning, the class worked together in a way which soon brought them out of their freshman obscurity.

One of the early projects was the planting of seven cherry trees down by the lake. The next event was a performance given for the delectation of the remainder of the student body and generally known as "rat night." In the evening of May Day, garbed in white, carrying vari-colored lanterns, the Freshmen wound up the path from the lake to the window of the May Queen, and there sang a song of the May.

Perhaps the greatest step forward taken by the Sophomore Class was the abolishment of rat court, for it was realized that Freshmen were quite tractable without its aid! The Sophomores chose Miss Pauline Turnbull, because of her friendliness and understanding, to be their sponsor during the three remaining years. The officers included Margaret Carpenter, President; Julia McClure, Vice-President; Margaret Lockwood, Secretary; and Elizabeth Darracott, Treasurer. The achievements of the year did not go unnoticed, and the class was awarded the Mortar Board cup in recognition of its school spirit.

The thirty-eighters, now "big sisters," elected Hilda Kirby, President; Julia Gunter, Vice-President; Ernestine Akers, Secretary; and Margaret Lockwood, Treasurer. Very early in the fall they began preparing for the Junior Prom, one of the loveliest and most successful ever given at Westhampton. This year, the Juniors again won the song contest, sponsored by the Athletic Association.

The Senior Class of 1938 welcomed the Freshmen into Westhampton with an impressive proclamation ceremony. In December, they were sponsors of a new social function—a buffet supper for Seniors and their dates with a dance afterwards. Thus began a new tradition. Another project undertaken by the class was a series of eugenics lectures. The Class of '38 seems to have possessed a knack for doing original things, for in February they sponsored the first costume co-ed; following this came a ping-pong tournament in the spring. While the Seniors were hostesses to 57 high school Seniors, the atmosphere about the campus became ultra collegiate, the guests being elaborately entertained. The Class officers were Margaret Carpenter, President; Martha Ware, Vice-President; Gene Austin, Secretary; and Julia Gunter, Treasurer.

Margaret Carpenter and Hilda Kirby were the authors of an unusual May Day, the theme being one of fairyland, with the crowning of the mortal queen of May by the fairy queen as its climax.

CLASS HISTORY

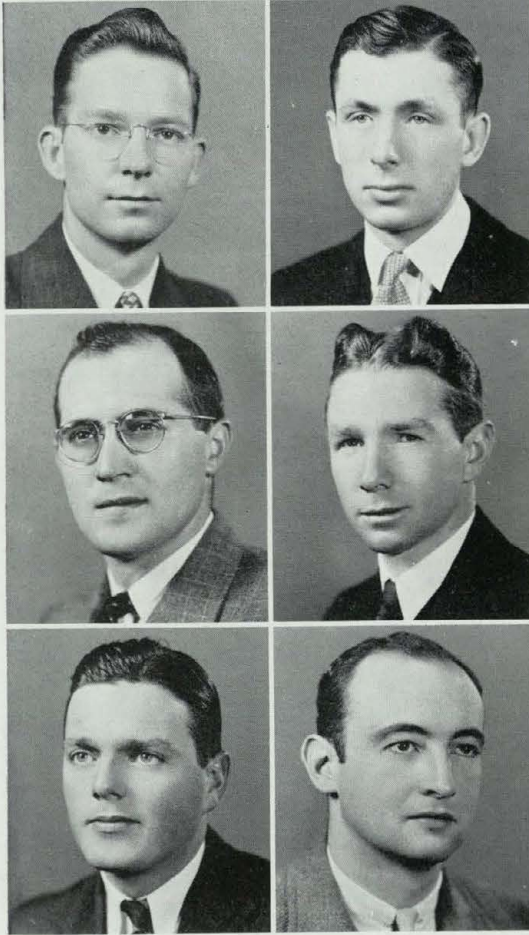

My dear "Captains":

The present college year, the second in Southern Conference competition for the University of Richmond, has netted us an athletic record for which we have no cause to be ashamed.

After finishing the year of 1935-1937 with the state championship in baseball and a good year in track, we entered the present year three of the fifteen Southern Conference schools in the matter of under-graduate male enrollment, our schedules must necessarily be quite difficult.

Our football team won five and lost four games with two victories and three defeats in Southern Conference competition. The defeat over V. M. I. was the first in the history of our University.

The basketball squad faced its schedule of nineteen difficult games with a senior captain, one Junior and the remaining players sophomores. The climax of the season came with the 34 to 23 victory over New York University. After the loss of captain Jacobs in the first game against Washington and Lee the sophomore squad pulled together and won seven straight games, finishing in first position in the Southern Conference. To be one of the eight teams out of fifteen to be chosen for this tournament was a worth while honor.

We have the smallest coaching staff, and it is often said that we have the poorest facilities for a full athletic program. In the conference, consequently our place near the top in two sports and well up in the second division in all other sports, gives us a record of which we have every right to be proud.

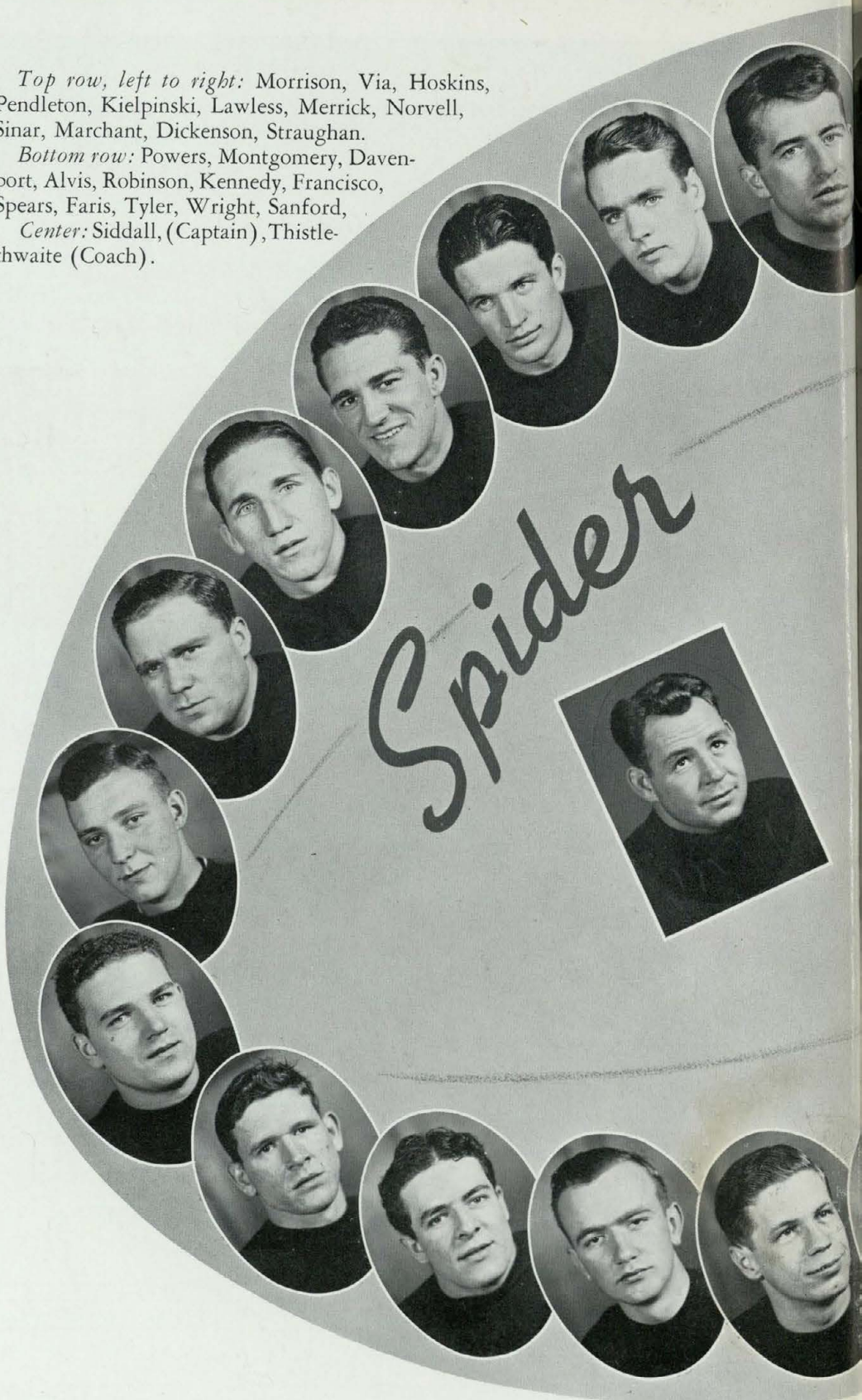

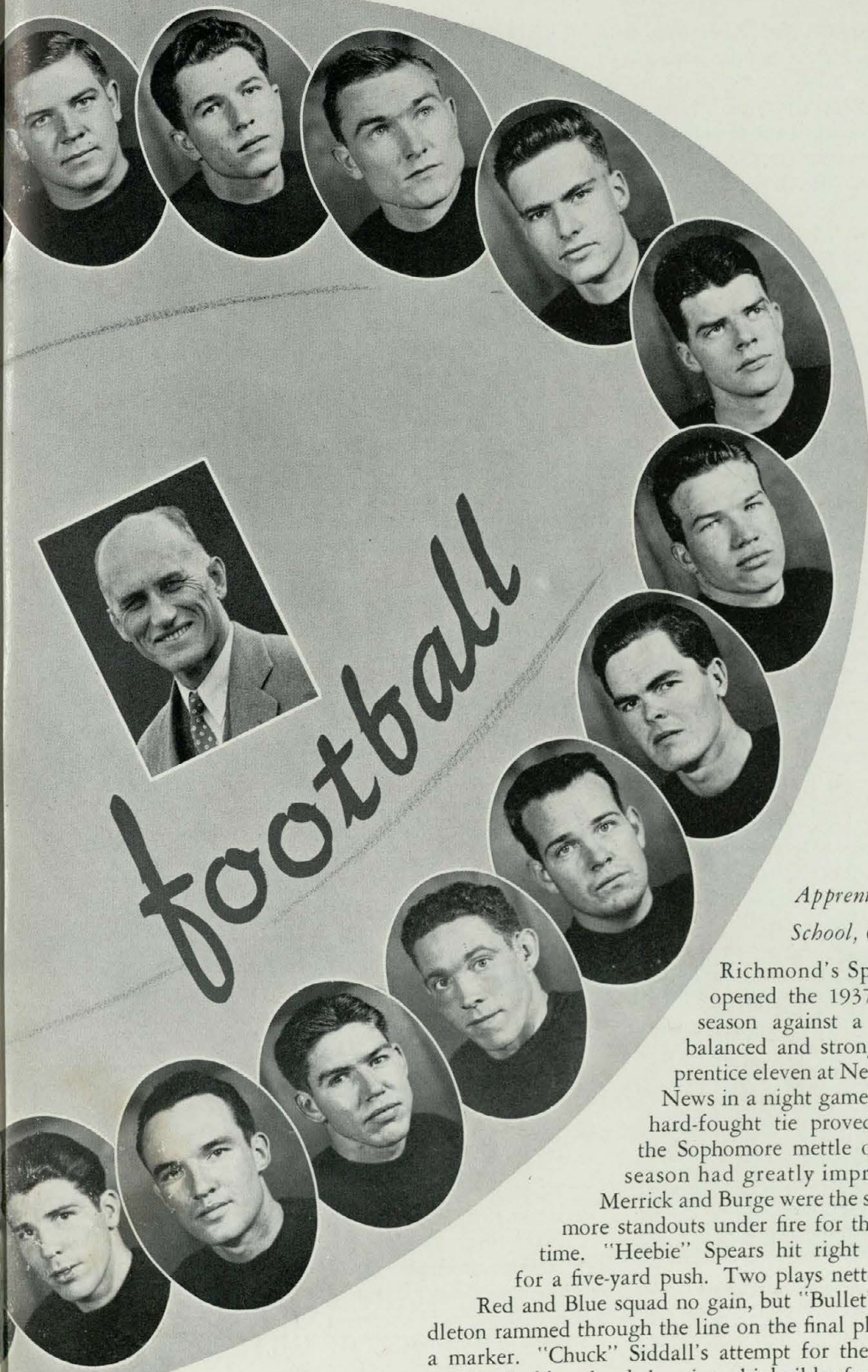

Apprentice School, 6-6

Richmond's Spiders opened the 1937 grid season against a well-balanced and strong Apprentice eleven at Newport News in a night game. The hard-fought tie proved that the Sophomore mettle of last season had greatly improved. Merrick and Burge were the sophomore standouts under fire for the first time. "Heebie" Spears hit right tackle for a five-yard push. Two plays netted the Red and Blue squad no gain, but "Bullet" Pendleton rammed through the line on the final play for a marker. "Chuck" Siddall's attempt for the point was blocked by a hard-charging, shipbuilder forewall. Late in the fourth quarter, Wilson and Compton

gained first downs for Apprentice with wide end sweeps, carrying the sphere down deep in Spider territory. Compton, on the next play, swept end for twelve yards, finally being knocked out of bounds on the Spider thirteen-yard line by chunky Bill Via. Compton then plunged right tackle for the score. Try for the extra point was blocked by Bill Burge.

Featuring the game was Pendleton's brilliant punting duel with Madsen. Both got off long booming kicks deep into the opponents' territory. Powers, Burge and Merrick stood out among the new men that played.

Randolph-Macon, 6-0

At Mayo Island on a hot, sultry afternoon, the Spiders tamed a veteran jacket eleven with a lone touchdown that came late in the fray. "Hoot" Pendleton proved the star of the day, for the Ashlanders never seemed to be able to stop his powerful line plunges as he lowered his head and rammed through.

In the opening moments of the game, Pendleton and Welch had a kicking duel, with Lawless making swift returns for the University of Richmond. In the initial quarter there were no goal line threats, and the longest Spider punt traveled down to the Jacket 25.

In the last quarter, Spears flipped a pass

to Burge, who lateraled to Kielpinski for a first down on the Jacket 31-yard line. The ball was again placed in play on the Randolph-Macon nine-yard line, first and goal to go. Spears made three yards through right guard. Pendleton drove over left for one more, and on the next down was not to be denied. Siddall's try for the extra point was low.

Washington and Lee, 0-6

With the Spider invasion of the Generals' stronghold, hopes for a State Championship team were dimmed for Richmond. Playing poor football the Spiders fumbled frequently, losing the ball whenever a chance to score presented itself.

Washington and Lee scored in the first quarter, after getting possession of the ball on the Spider 45, after a short kick by Pendleton. Craft passed for twenty-five yards to Borries, who caught the ball on Richmond's twenty. Howard spun through for 13 yards, took the ball again through the line for a first down on the eighty-yard line. Dunlap threw a long to Spessard. Interference was called on the play, and the Generals were given the ball on Richmond's

eight, first and four to go. Howard rammed over on his second try at the line.

In the second half, the Spiders made several drives deep into the Generals' territory, but the attack bogged down as the ball neared the goal.

Hoskins, on a long pass to Marchant, began a belated rally that ended when a Spears pass was intercepted by Dunlap. The game ended as Richmond was again put on defense.

The U. of R. line played stellar ball all evening, but pass interception and fumbles broke the spirit of a hard-fighting ball club. Hoskins and Marchant were Spider standouts.

Roanoke, 21-12

On a damp field at Roanoke, a superior Spider eleven downed a fighting Maroon team. Scoring in every period, Richmond's line held beautifully, while the backs drove through the hard-charging Roanoke forewall.

Stuart Hoskins began the fireworks, cutting off left tackle in the first period behind perfect interference, slipped past the halves, and outran the safety man to score. "Hoot" Pendleton, just before the end of the half, climaxed a forty-yard drive by plunging over the Maroon line for another touchdown.

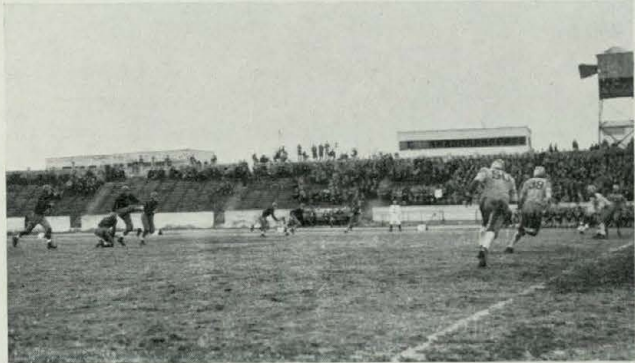
In the third period Roanoke began a scoring thrust that was not to be denied, after Crumley repeatedly went through the Spider line for gains. Red and Blue retaliated with a swift touchdown, climaxed by a forward lateral from Spears to Burge to Kielpinski. Ken Moore, of the Roanoke eleven, made a difficult catch of Pednau's pass over the goal to score the host's final touchdown in the clos-

ing moments of the game. A gallant bid by the crimson men was stemmed by the fighting Spiders.

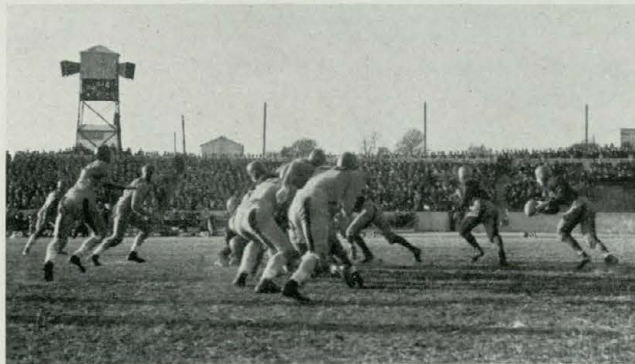
Virginia Military Institute, 7-21

In a game much closer than the score indicated, the Flying Squadron and the Spiders played a cautious game. In the initial quarter, Trezciak's eighty-yard kick ended a brief Spider threat as the two elevens fought on even terms.

Capitalizing on Pendleton's short kicks, V.M.I. drove down to the Richmond 19 on straight football with Shu carrying the sphere. Again Red and Blue suffered



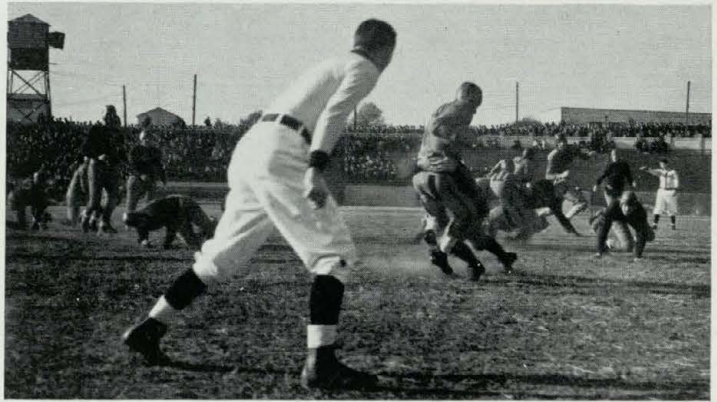
KICKOFF

a break when interference was ruled, giving the Cadets possession of the ball on Richmond's four-yard line. Holding magnificently for three downs, the line gave in on the last to hard plunging Paul Shu. Soon after, Coleman, Cadet tackle, blocked a Spider kick on the thirty, which rolled to the twenty. Coleman picked it up and ran down to Richmond's three before he was finally stopped. Trezciak crashed over for the tally.

Again Trezciak's educated toe put the Spiders on their own one-foot line, and a poor punt gave the Cadets

their last opportunity to score. From the forty-yard line, Trezciak carried the ball over on three plays. Richmond began to click late in the game, when Hoskins intercepted a pass; he and Lawless carried the ball over for the U. of R. tally. A last-minute drive bogged down when the whistle ended the rooters' clamor for another touchdown.

Citadel, 0-26

Under the lights at Charleston, the University of Richmond made its poorest showing against a classy Southern eleven. In the first quarter, under the impetus of Robinson, the military men pushed over two scores.

Almost a repetition of the first half was the last half of the contest. Robinson and Smith, on long end sweeps, pushed over another score before the third quarter was many minutes old. As the game was drawing to a

close Robinson ran sixty yards through the entire Richmond team for six points.

Duquesne, 0-24

Strictly on the defensive, the University of Richmond encountered a highly touted Duquesne at Pittsburgh under the arcs. Boyd Brumbaugh and Clipper Smith accounted for the two first-half tallies after runs of 75 and 65 yards, respectively. On a deceptive play, the Dukes gained a score on a pass from Onder to Mangore, who lateraled to McKeeta. This play was good for 49 yards. Duquesne's final score came after a 74-yard march down the field. Onder, hard-driving fullback, plunged over for the touchdown.

Late in the game, the Spider offense began to click against a decidedly superior eleven. On two drives the University of Richmond carried the ball down to the Dukes' four-yard

line, but then the line became a stone wall which the Spiders could not penetrate.

Offensively and defensively the Red and Blue team played a good game, in spite of a four-touchdown trouncing. The Dukes gained 504 yards to Richmond's 264 total.

Virginia Polytechnic Institute, 12-7

In its first home game in many weeks, Richmond capitalized on its scoring opportunities early in the game to defeat the Tech men. Striking swiftly, after Lawless returned DeMuro's kick to V.P.I. 6, Hoskins tossed a short pass to Straughan who lateraled the ball to Bill Morrison. He carried the ball over to score.

Richmond's second score came when Lawless and Hoskins had placed the ball in scoring position on off tackle sweeps. Lawless went through the line for eight yards. Pendleton then lowered his head and charged into the V.P.I. line for the touchdown.

In the second half, after the Tech men had been stopped on the U. of R. one-foot line at the end of the first half, Henry and DeMuro, Tech's great backs, put the Spiders on the defense. DeMuro returned a Spider punt from his own 8 to his 34. Henry plunged through the line, broke away, and was finally hauled down on the Red and Blue 46. Doxey then caught a 16-yard toss from Henry to place the ball deep in U. of R. territory. Darnell and Henry then drove the ball over.

At this point lanky Ed. Sinar entered the game, and, with his long kicks, more than made up for Tech gains. His toe kept Richmond out of danger as V.P.I. repeatedly sought to score. This was Richmond's closest game and best one of the season.

Hampden-Sydney, 19-0

Taking advantage of a Tiger fumble on the U. of R. 35, which Bill Via recovered, the Spiders pushed down into striking distance of the goal. Spears then passed twenty yards to Marchant who tossed a lateral to Dickinson.

Dickinson carried the ball across for the tally.

On a long punt return by Lawless to the Richmond 42, Red and Blue again drove over the goal with runs by Lawless, Hoskins and Pendleton.

In the final quarter, Coach Glenn decided to use some Sophomore talent, and in went Bill Robinson. On his first play, he cut off left end, faked past the halves and was finally brought down on the two-yard line after an eighty-yard jaunt. On the next play he went over. The final minutes were featured by another drive by Richmond which ended as the whistle blew.

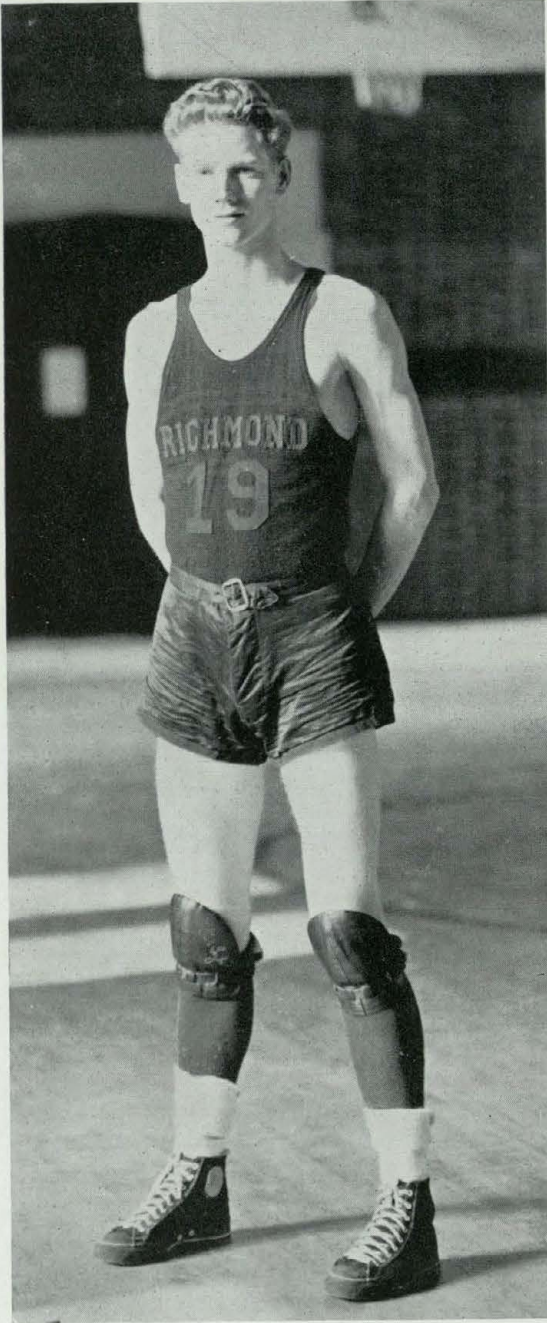
William and Mary, 6-0

The Indians' famed "Pete" Bunch was held in check as the Spiders outplayed their traditional rivals on Turkey day to win by a single tally made by Richmond's all stater, A. B. Marchant.

Striking swiftly in the first quarter, the Red and Blue team scored, then hung to its slim lead for three more periods of the game. When Ed. Sinar's long arms batted down Bunch's punt, Morrison recovered for the Spiders on the William and Mary 25, to pave the way for the tally. On three plays the team gained 6 yards, then on the fourth down, Hoskins faded back, rifled a low pass to Marchant, who ran six yards to score. After this it was all Richmond, with Bunch completing only one pass and making one 20-yard run in the entire first half.

In the line, stars of the game were Marchant, Norvell, and Merrick. Marchant was invincible on his flank until a back injury forced him from the game. Norvell, at guard, stopped many plays before they could reach the line of scrimmage. Merrick, through his keen play diagnosis was able to cut down long gains on the part of Bunch, Indian ace.

Playing their last game were Captain Siddall, Kielpinski, and Montgomery. These men were the bulwarks of the stone wall that the U. of R. line presented to Indian backs.

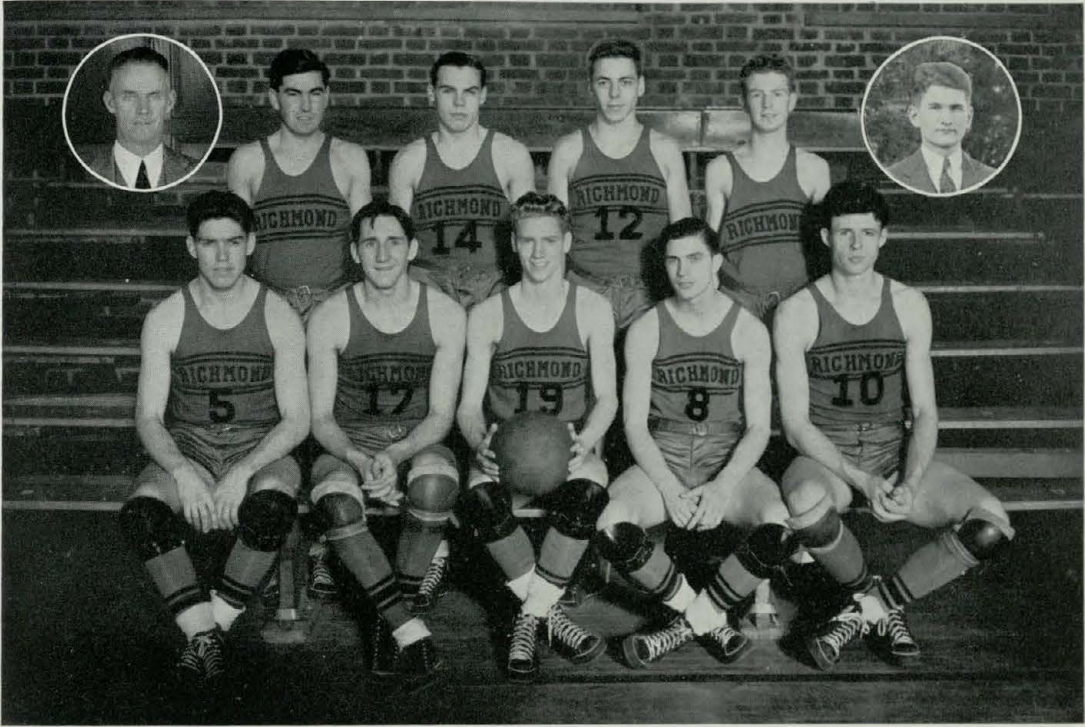

BASKETBALL

WITH four of his five court veterans of the past year gone with graduation and only one tow-headed performer, namely Captain Petey Jacobs, left, Coach Pitt faced prospects for the 1937-'38 basketball season squarely. They were poor, to say the least.

A host of hard working sophomores, whose only experience was a year of freshman basketball, turned out to be the salvation of a quint led by the unquenchable spirit of Petey Jacobs. Out of the nineteen games played during the regular season, the University of Richmond team won fifteen. When seven games were still left to be played on the schedule, Captain Jacobs was injured at Lexington playing against the Generals. Determined to lead the team to victory, Jacobs was trying hard. He took a bad spill, and thus ended his career in Basketball forever at the University. Yet, in the games that he had played, he was hailed by all coaches and referees in the conference as its "greatest guard."

After a comparatively easy victory over the Ashland Jackets, the Spiders pulled a distinct upset by downing the favored Terrapins of College Park by a 31-26 count. Then, on their initial tour, to the Carolinas, the Spiders took lickings from both Duke and Wake Forest by close scores. The Techmen from V.P.I., in the same week, again took the Spiders' measure. Later in the season, Richmond's more experienced quint downed Tech and the Deacons to even the count with these schools. Against Washington and Lee the Spiders broke even, winning at home and losing at the camp of the Generals. Coach Tilson had an experienced and well balanced squad which gave the Spiders their greatest trouble inside the state.



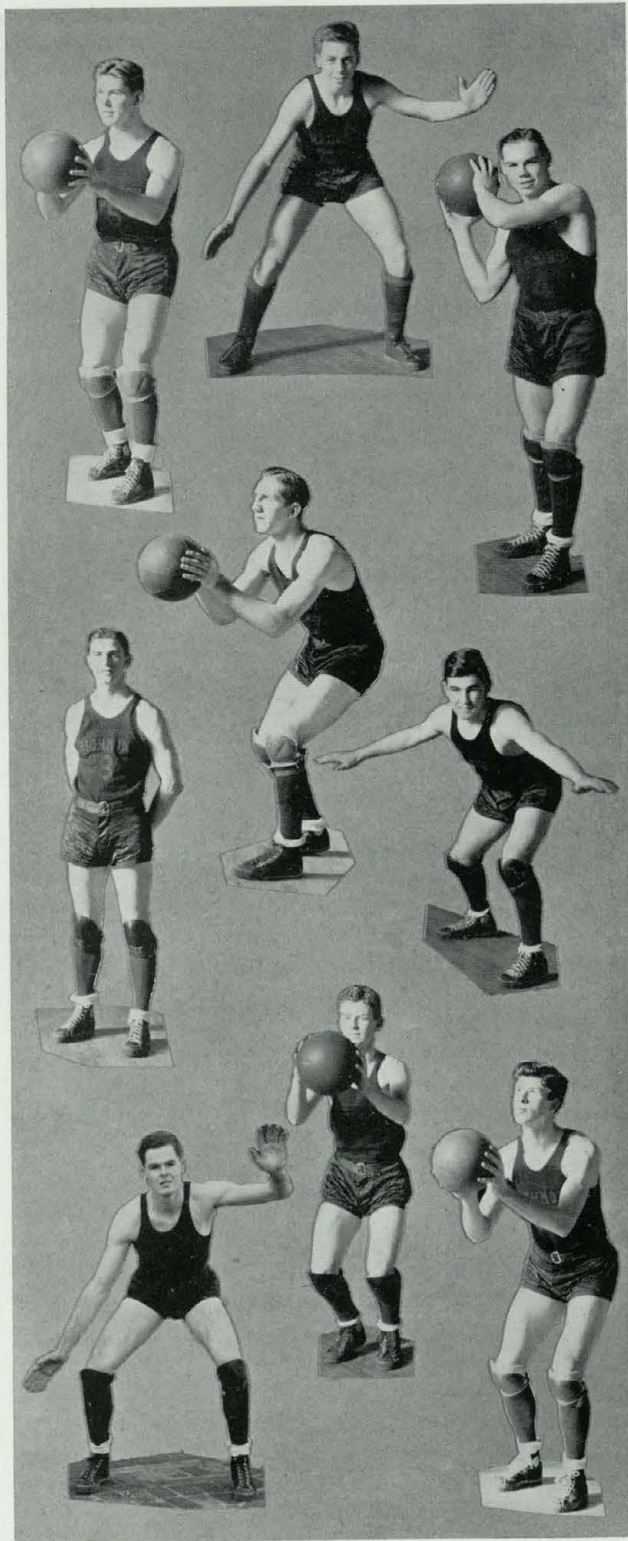
VARSIY BASKETBALL

The highlight of the season came against the Violets of New York University who were touring the South on a warm-up campaign. In a hard, brilliant fight the Spiders outbattled the New Yorkers by a 34-25 count. Captain Jacobs played his best that evening, guarding like a multi-armed octopus, and scoring frequently. This was the first time that the University was able to take over a strong Northern team in Basketball.

At the end of the season, the University of Richmond was well up in the state standings, boasting of thirteen wins against two defeats, both by teams that the Spiders later defeated. Also, in the Southern Conference, Richmond stood well among the first eight teams. In the Conference playoffs, the Spiders met their nemesis in the form of a brilliant Clemson team, and were defeated in the first round by a 35-32 count.

Sophomore sensations were Stuart Hoskins, famous for his long set shots and his fighting ability, James Ely, outstanding for his smooth floor play, Bill Burge, known to all for his guarding against N. Y. U., and John Wright, who could toss the ball from any angle toward the hoops. All of these men tallied over a hundred points before the season had ended. Seabury Stoneburner, bothered by a bad ankle, nevertheless, saw lots of action, and was a steady player. Ed Bragg, 165 pounds of real fight, also played fine ball for the Spiders.

"Heebie" Spears, junior, and member of last season's squad, after the absence of Captain Jacobs, was named by his mates to fill his shoes. It was he, who with dogged determination fought to win against great odds. His floor work was of the best and his ability to handle the ball won him an important berth. He will again lead the team next year.

Duke, Wake Forest, Washington and Lee, and Virginia Polytechnic Institute, were the only teams that beat the Spiders during the regular season.

Coach Pitt, as always, the likeable and unselfish tutor, had occasion to be proud of the machine that he turned out. He produced a winning team, composed of four-fifths sophomores, under fire for the first time. Yet, in his characteristic way, Coach was unwilling to claim any of the team's glory for himself, so he declared, "I'm

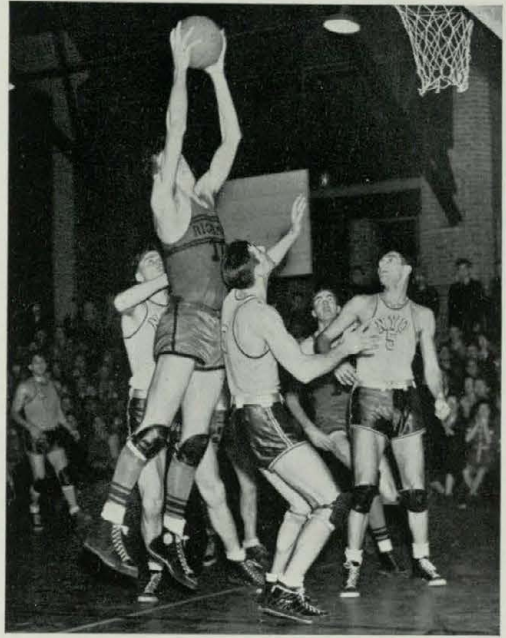


mighty proud of the boys." The boys say,

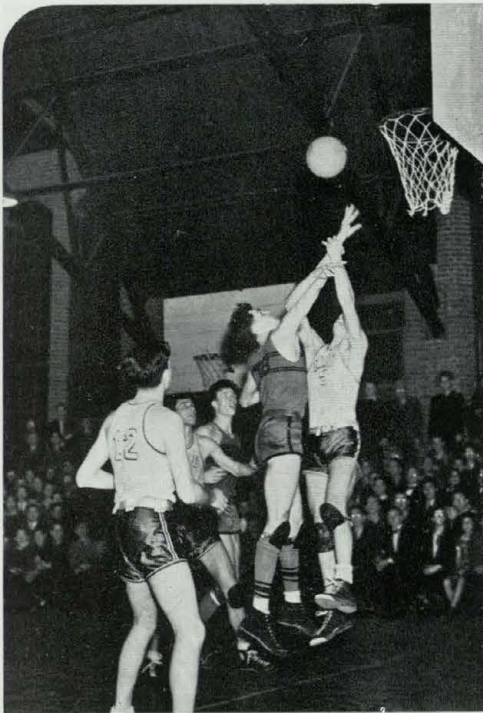

Coached for the first time by Ex-Captain Bucky Jacobs, all-state forward for two years, the University of Richmond freshmen had quite an impressive record for the year, downing four opponents and losing to four teams.

Outstanding men who played well for the freshmen were Dick Humbert, versatile six-footer, who played guard in a way that reminded fans strangely of Petey Jacobs, Richard Cash, towering center, who played fine ball all year until he was injured. Hugh Crisman, brainy forward, George Shackelford, hard-fighting and hard-working guard, and Ed Garber, who never gave up until the final whistle had blown.

Playing against one of the state's best teams in the little Tigers from Hampden-Sydney, the frosh evened the count in two hard battles, winning the first time 32-28, and on the home floor losing by a 17-20 score. By virtue of his hard playing in these games, Dick Humbert made the all-state frosh quint.

Massanutten and Fork Union Military Academy both took the measure of the little Spiders in hard fought contests, after two spider aces had been eliminated, one for scholastic trouble and the other with an injury.

In the season's finale, the little Indians scalped the frosh 53-26 to gain sweet revenge for an earlier 23-21 win by the Richmond five.

BASEBALL

THE 1937 baseball season was a highly successful one for the Spiders in two respects. From the standpoint of team-play the Red and Blue baseballers brought home to Richmond the state championship, after sharing it with William and Mary's Indians in 1936. From the standpoint of individual achievement, this '37 season produced one of the most famous athletes ever to wear the Red and Blue. He is Newton "Bucky" Jacobs, the Spider captain, who left the U. of R. a record that has rarely, if ever before, been achieved in college baseball in any section of the country, that of pitching three no-hit, no-run games. Somewhat lacking in physique but with a competitive heart, "Bucky" won seventeen games against one loss in three years of college playing.

Spring hadn't quite arrived, but baseball was certainly in the air when Coach Malcolm U. Pitt called the first practice on Milhiser field for his diamond candidates. It was not without some misgivings that Coach Pitt viewed his prospects for the forthcoming season, for he had the task of filling four important positions made vacant by graduation the previous year. After two weeks of training, however, Coach Malcolm U. Pitt put together a strong combination which later rolled over all state opposition.

Upon the shoulders of Captain "Bucky" Jacobs and James "Slick" Trevett, rested the major portion of the hurling chores. George George, a sophomore, took care of the catching vacancy in fine style, while Jimmy Mundy looked like a veteran at first base, a position which he had never played before. Hard-hitting Gus Lynch at second, the sensational "Toots" Garber at shortstop, and red-headed Petey Jacobs at the hot corner rounded out an

imposing infield. Neely Godsey, "clean-up man," Avalon Marchant, and "Hoss" Walton formed the Spider outfield.

The Spiders got off to a good start in their quest for the state championship by defeating the Buckeyes of Ohio State, 6 to 1, in the first game. Jacobs and Trevvett divided the pitching assignment and were equally effective. A few days later Richmond beat Washington and Lee for their second victory. On a trip down into North Carolina, the U. of R. was defeated by Wake Forest College, but amid a barrage of base-hits including Neely Godsey's home run triumphed over North Carolina's Tarheels by the score of 9 to 8.

After defeating Hampden-Sydney, 4 to 3, the Spiders scored a 1 to 0 victory over Virginia Tech, one of the closest games ever played at the Richmond City Stadium. Captain "Bucky" Jacobs came out of the contest in possession of a brilliant no-hit, no-run game, the first of three for the season. Ruffner Murray, pitching for the Gobblers, allowed only one hit, a single by third baseman Petey Jacobs. Coach Pitt's protégés then went on a six-game winning streak, smashing William and Mary, Randolph-Macon, V.M.I., and scoring second victories over Hampden-Sydney, V.P.I., and Washington and Lee. Captain Jacobs chalked up his second no-hit, no-run contest against Hampden-Sydney during the victory streak, while the game with William and Mary at Williamsburg was won by Gus Lynch's homer in the tenth inning.

Wake Forest's strong aggregation next invaded the Spider's domain and again defeated the Red and Blue team, 8 to 5. Although Richmond overwhelmed the University of Virginia by the score of 12 to 1 in the next contest, these same Cavaliers were responsible a week later for Captain "Bucky" Jacobs' only loss in his

three years of varsity competition. The Spiders could collect only two hits from Virginia's Bud Abbit, and Jacobs' great three-year victory streak was brought to a close.

After losing to the Spiders for four consecutive years, the Navy crushed the U. of R. at Annapolis with the Spiders playing their worst game of the year. Richmond ended the season by duplicating previous victories over V.M.I. and William and Mary. The 2 to 0 triumph over the Keydets marked a marvelous feat, Jacobs' third no-hit game of the year. When the Spiders downed William and Mary in the last game, they walked off the field in possession of the state championship title.

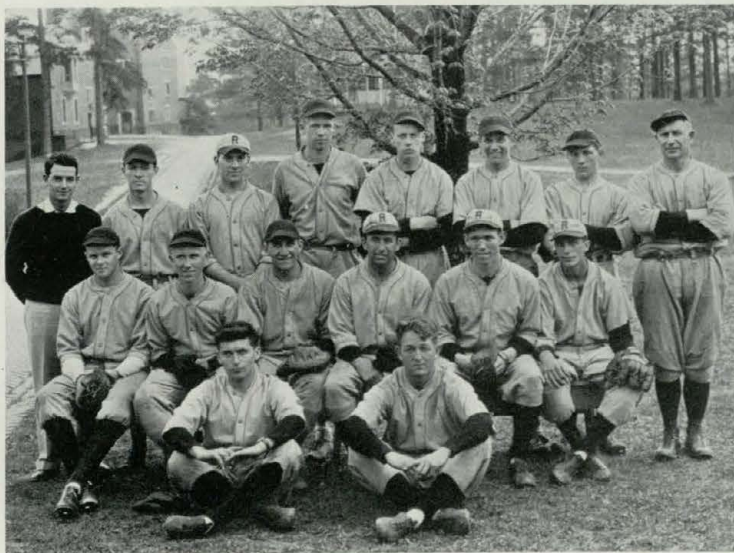
Due to masterful hurling by Captain Jacobs and James "Slick" Trevvett and the ability to come through with base hits in the pinches, the Spiders of 1937 turned in a highly successful season, winning fourteen and losing four games. Coach Malcolm Pitt can rightfully swell his chest with pride when the name of his star pupil, Newton "Bucky" Jacobs, is mentioned, for Jacobs' feat of pitching three no-hit, no-run games in one season is an unheard of one and will probably never be duplicated. "Bucky" later signed a contract with the Washington Senators of the American League and went directly into the majors, after receiving offers from several major league teams.

Albert "Petey" Jacobs, hard-hitting third baseman, succeeded his brother "Bucky" as captain of the Spider nine and with only two regulars graduating from this year's squad, the U. of R. bids fair to come up with another strong team of championship calibre next year.

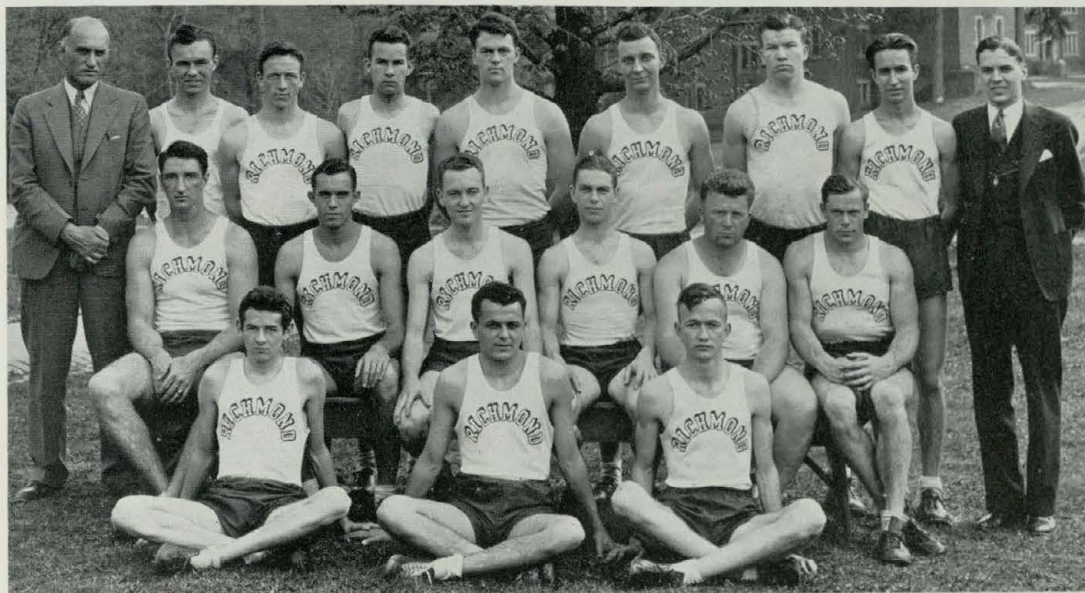
Although injured in a meet with William and Mary, Captain Lumpkin made a new name for himself when he broke the existing Southern Conference record for the two-mile in the indoor tourney at Chapel Hill.

T R A C K

ALTHOUGH the Spiders broke even in six dual meets, the U. of R's 1937 track team was considered by some Spider followers to be the best in twelve years. The first reason for this assertion was the fact that Richmond defeated William and Mary's Indians for the first time in twelve years. The Spiders were "laying for" the Indians all season and went to Williamsburg determined to scalp the red men, and this they did for the first time since 1926.

In addition to this, the '37 season brought to the fore one of the greatest track men ever to wear the Red and Blue, in the person of William Latane Lumpkin, crack distance runner and captain of the team. Popular "Lump," as he is familiarly known, whose running career in college closed with graduation in June, leaves behind him an outstanding record. During his college career he broke twelve collegiate records on the cinder paths, including every Richmond distance record except one. He missed Thorpe's record for the mile by nine-tenths of a second. Lumpkin holds the school record for the freshman mile, freshman and varsity cross country, varsity two-mile, and the Southern Conference two-mile indoor record.

An indoor dual meet with the University of Virginia opened the 1937 track activities for the Spiders. Although not considered a threat to Virginia's strong squad, Richmond garnered enough first and second places to gain a tie, 45 to 45. Jack Sanford, in the shotput, Ed Field, in the 50-yard dash, Howard Denton, pole vault, and captain Lumpkin, won first places for Richmond.

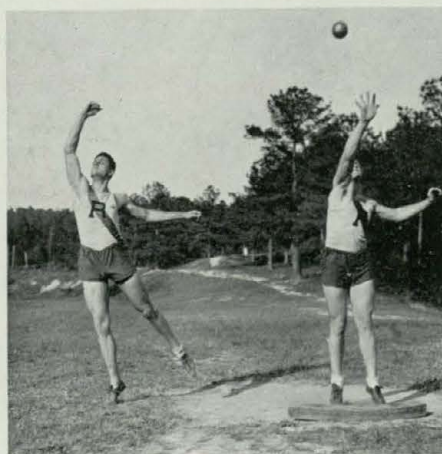


Captain Lumpkin brought Richmond's first Southern Conference record home with him when he broke the existing mark for the two-mile in the conference indoor tourney at Chapel Hill, North Carolina. Richmond entered eight men and placed fourth in the scoring. The first outdoor meet of the year was held at Charlottesville with the Spiders going down before the Cavaliers by the close score of 59 to 67. Going into the last event, the javelin throw, there was only a one-point difference in the score, but the U. of R. was able to get only third place, thereby losing the meet. Lumpkin and Frank Alvis, star hurdler, with two first places, paced the Spiders' scoring.

The second dual meet, with Randolph-Macon, on Milhiser field, was a romp for the Spiders. Richmond took every first place and the majority of the second places, posting the overwhelming score of 112 to 14 over the weak Yellow Jacket squad. The Spiders' next victory, the long-awaited one over William and Mary, brought more joy than any other to Spider backers. Held at Williamsburg before a large crowd of spectators, the contest was extremely close throughout, with the lead changing several times. In the final event, the low hurdles, Richmond's Frank Alvis went up against Walter Zable, who had defeated him pre-

viously in the Southern Conference tournament. With a final spurt, Alvis barely nosed out Zable to give the Spiders their margin of victory. Although they left Williamsburg victors over their traditional rivals, the Spiders were dealt a great stroke of ill-luck that day, for it was discovered that Captain Lumpkin had broken a small bone in his foot. This injury served to keep him off the cinder paths for the remainder of the season.

Even without the services of their captain, the Red and Blue harriers brought home the bacon from Lexington a few days later when they crushed Washington and Lee, 75 to 51. In topping the Generals by 24 points, the U. of R. showed outstanding strength. Frank Alvis stood out by his defeat of the much-publicized Rogers in the low hurdles. The Spiders did not fare as well with V.M.I.'s Keydets a week later on their second trip to Lexington. Richmond lost to V.M.I. by the same score by which they had defeated W. & L., 75 to 51. Bill O'Flaherty's leap of 5 feet 6 inches took first place in the high jump, while Jack Sanford recorded such a good toss in the discus event, 136 feet 8½ inches, that V.M.I.'s Jim Farley had to set a new V.M.I. record in order to place a close second to Sanford's throw.

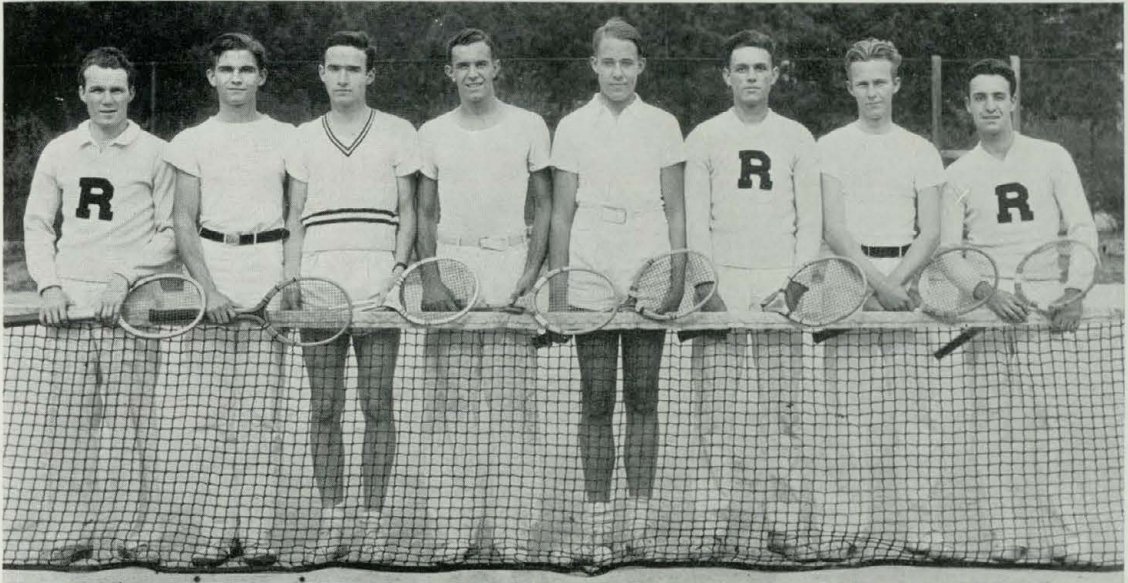
In the last dual meet of the year, Maryland invaded Milhiser field, and led by Bill Guckeyson, triumphed over the Richmond tracksters, 72 to 54. Guckeyson, husky football star, garnered fifteen points, with first places in the shot, discus, and javelin events. Jack Bristow came through with flying colors for the Spiders, breaking the school record for the 100-yard dash with the time of 9.9 seconds. Bristow accomplished the feat in spite of a bad knee which gave way just after he broke the tape. Howard Denton vaulted twelve feet to win his event easily.

The Southern Conference outdoor tourney in the middle of May brought the season to a close. The Spiders placed seventh to a strong Duke University team which set a new record in scoring 78 points. The season was considered a distinct success by the Spiders in spite of having lost three meets. Frank Alvis, plucky junior who was outstanding in every meet, was honored for his stellar performance by being chosen captain of next year's squad. With a good freshman squad coming up to lend a hand and with many holdovers from this year's team, prospects are bright for a good season next year.

TEAM BALANCE rather than individual brilliance carried the University of Richmond tennis team to unprecedented heights in the 1937 season. Dropping only one match, the Spiders won 17 of their 18 engagements and were runners-up to the mighty North Carolina for the Southern Conference championship.

Al Dickinson, captain and number one player, was succeeded by Bobby Leitch, Richmond public courts champion and runner-up for the Richmond City Championship.

Leitch played number two on the 1937 team with Jerry Epstein at number three; George Chalmers, four; and Carroll Williams and Bob White at fifth and sixth positions. Other members of the squad were Jimmy Chapin and Jack Brooks.

Richmond won two victories each over Wake Forest, N. C. State, Maryland, Hampden-Sydney, William and Mary, Washington and Lee, and V. M. I., and won single matches from Lehigh, American University, and Georgetown. Virginia was the only team to defeat the Spiders in dual meet competition.

The University was host to the Southern Conference tennis tournament which was played on the Country Club of Virginia courts. North Carolina won in a romp but second honors went to the Red and Blue representatives.

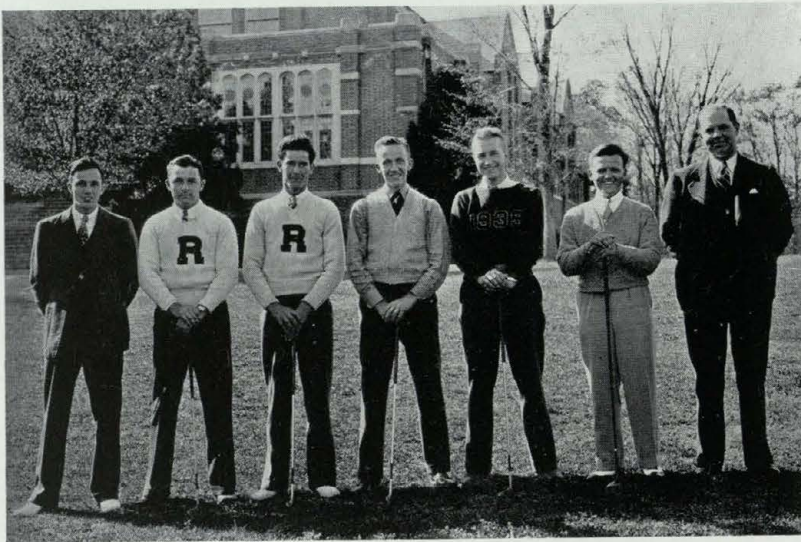

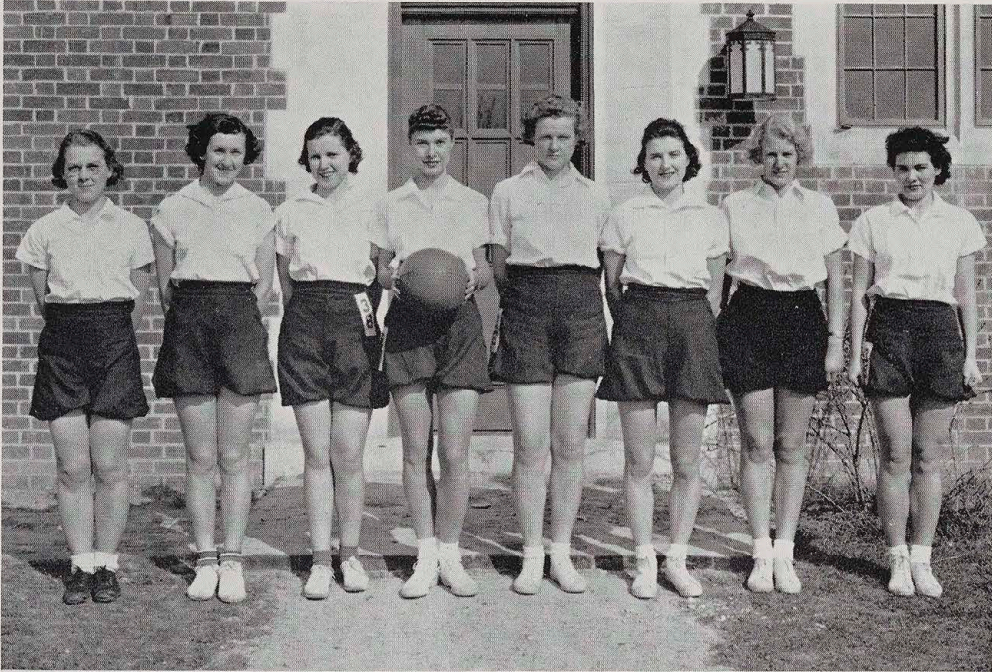
BEAVER COLLEGE 35; WESTHAMPTON 20

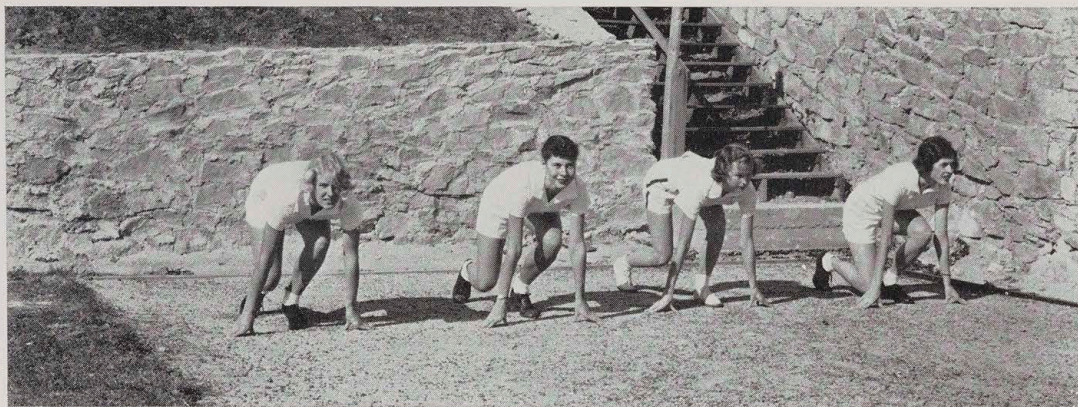

Seniors, Juniors, and Sophomores are eligible for the varsity team. The four people who score the most points in the inter-class track meet receive letters in track.

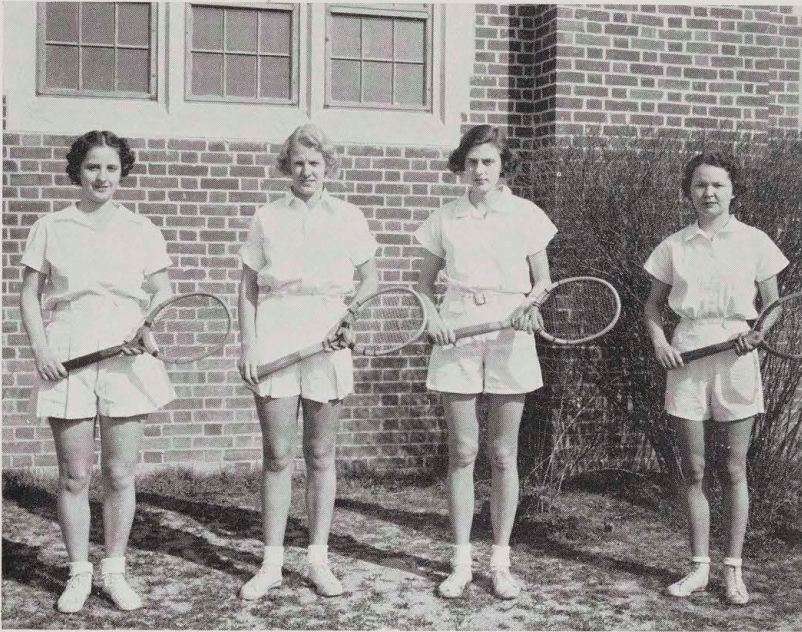

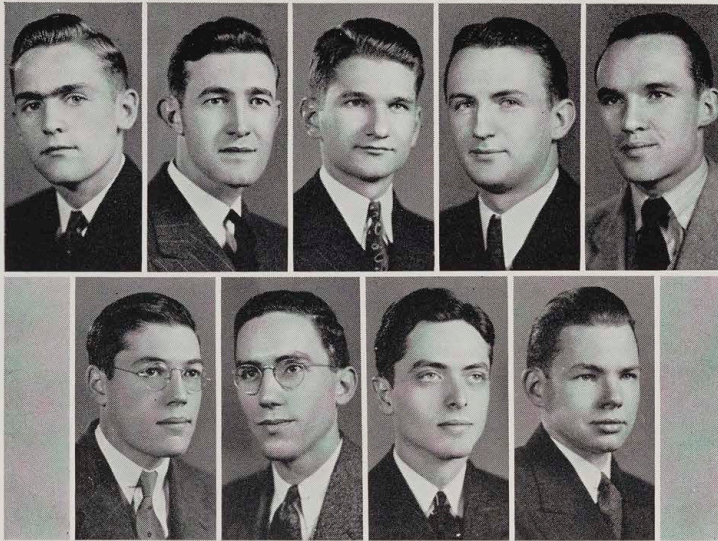

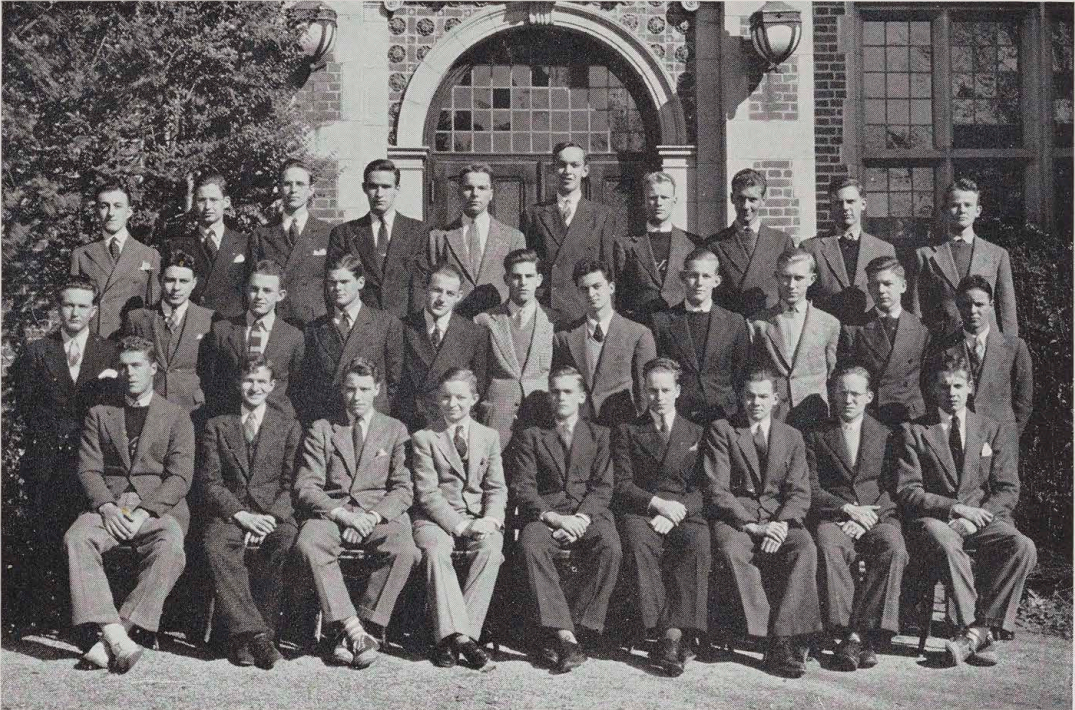

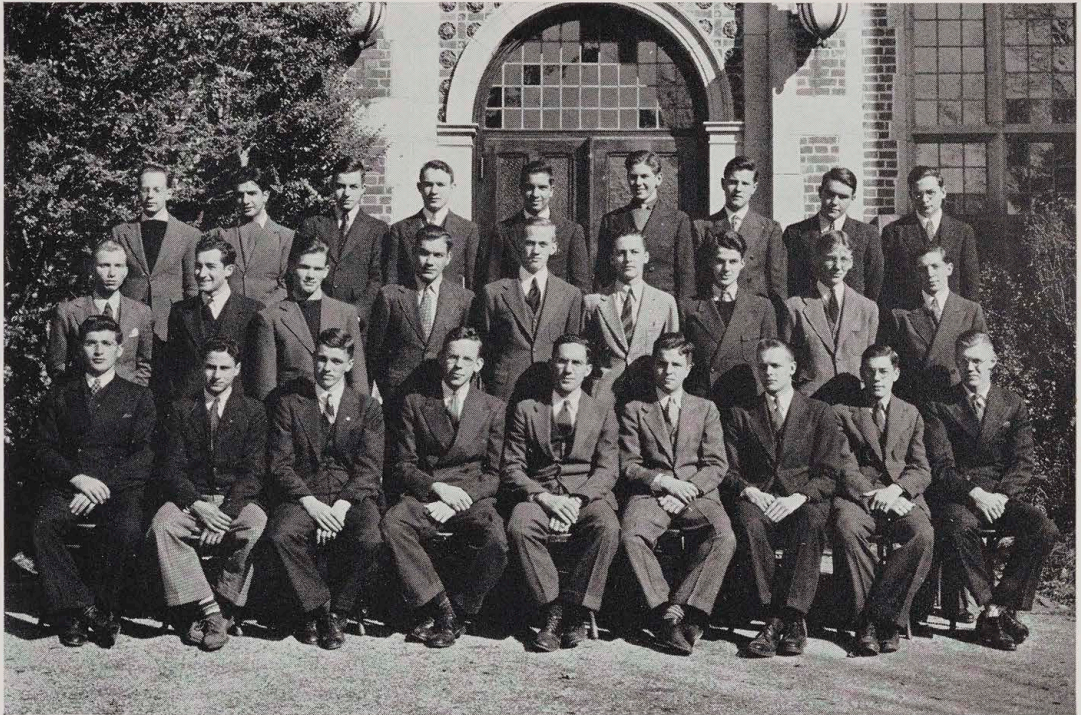
PHILOLOGIAN LITERARY SOCIETY

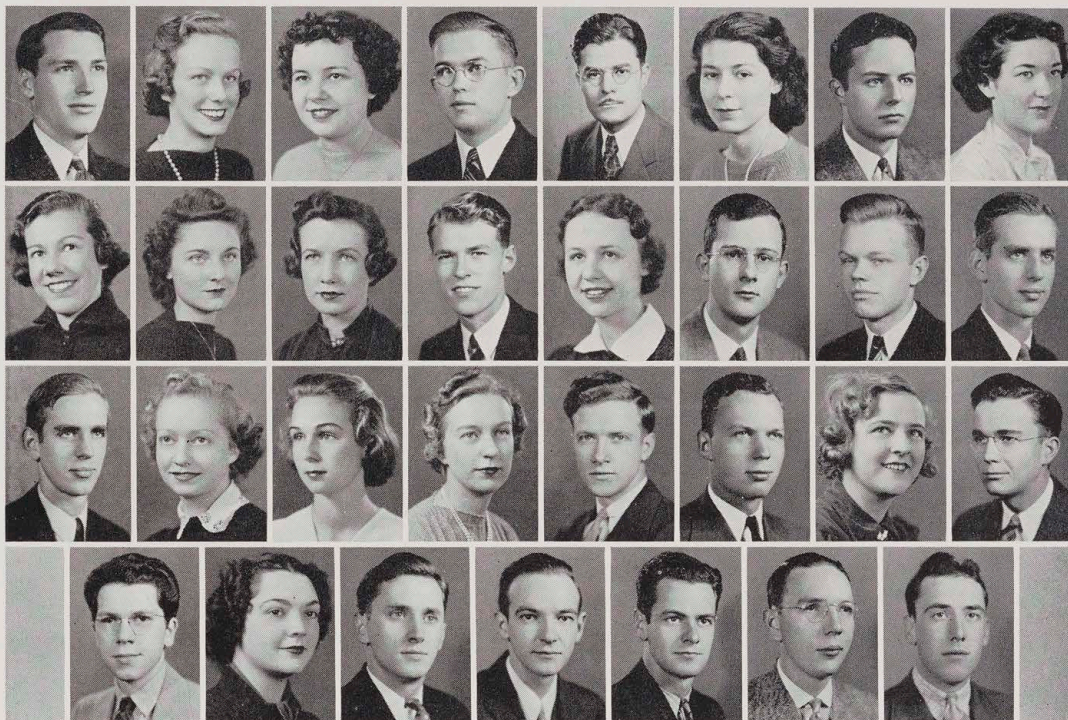

UNIVERSITY PLAYERS

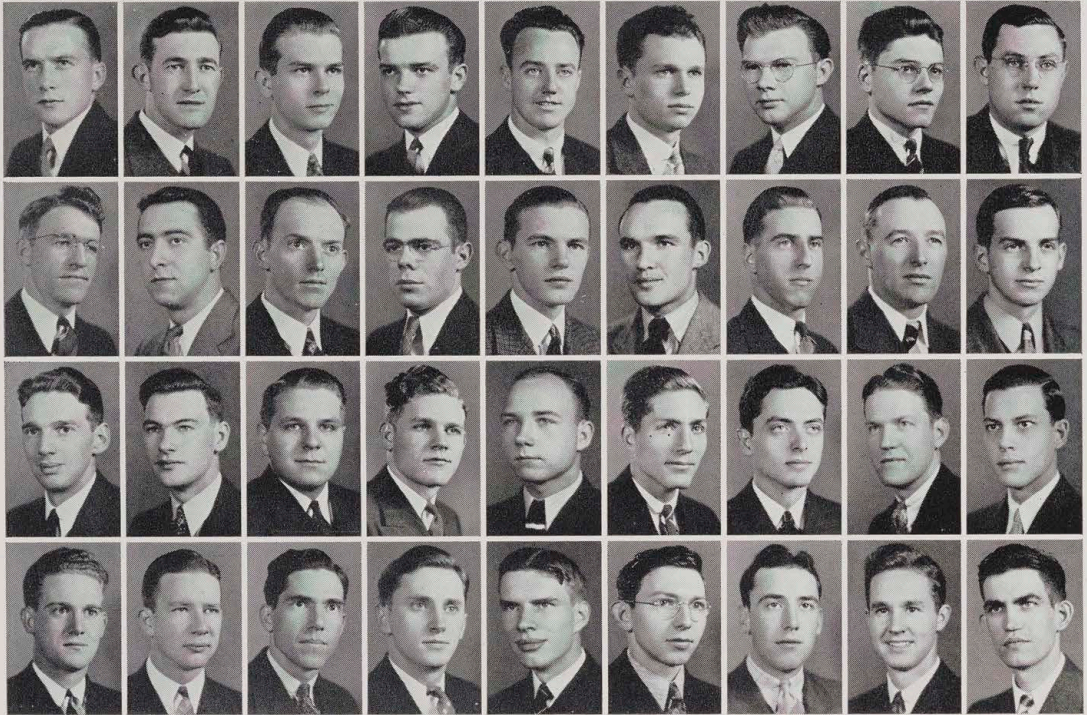
