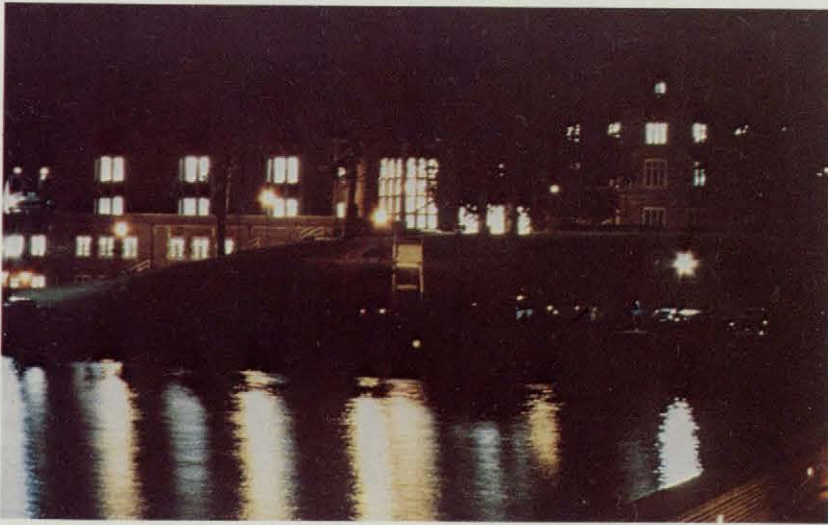






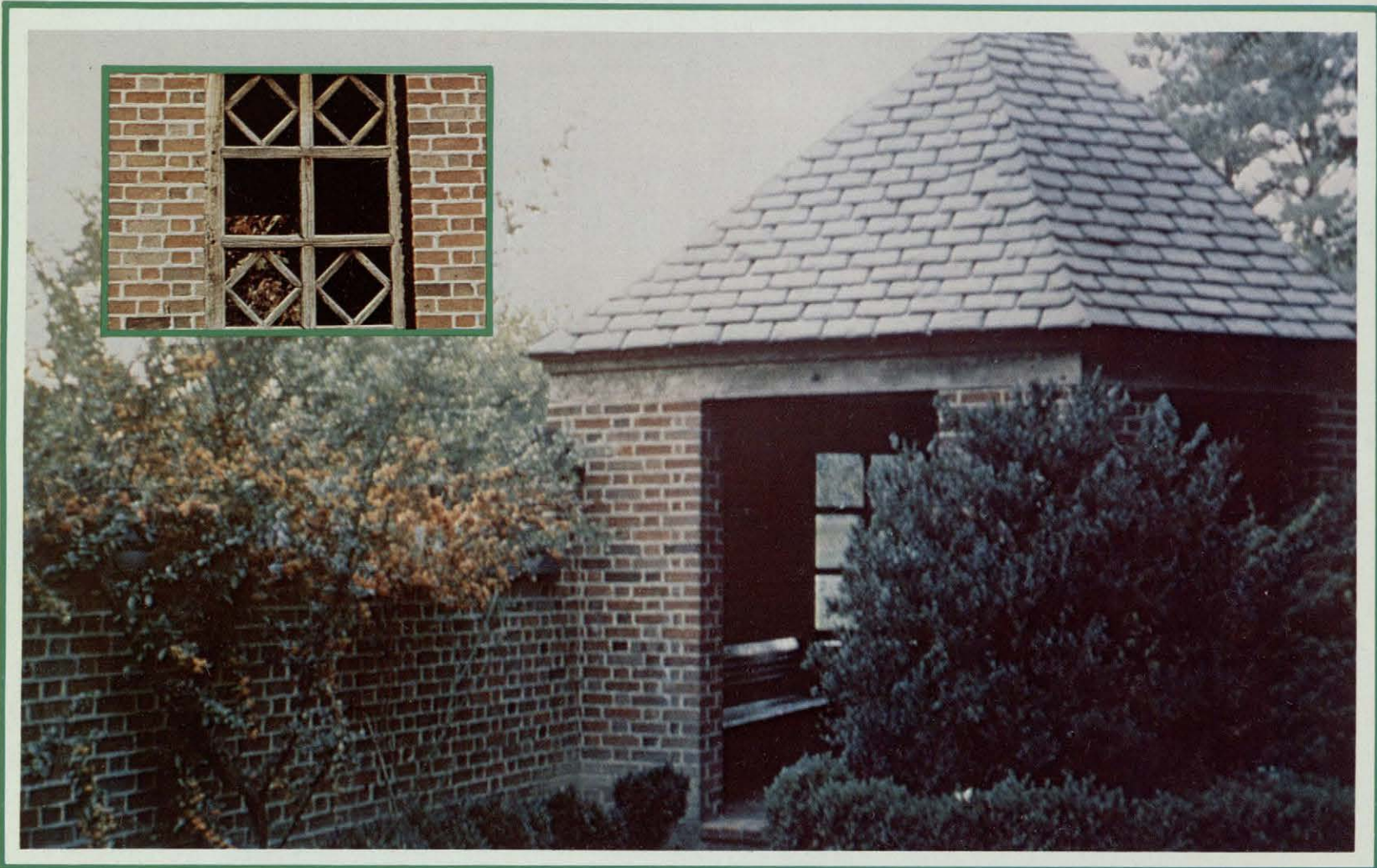












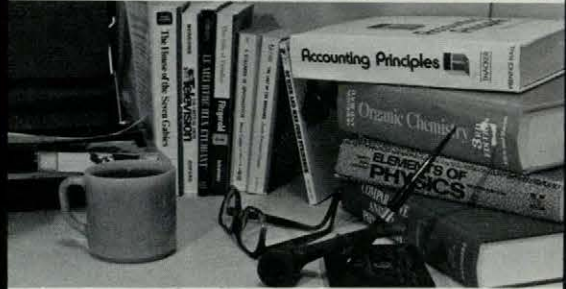


Cannon Memorial Chapel

The University of Richmond. The name has many different connotations to different people. 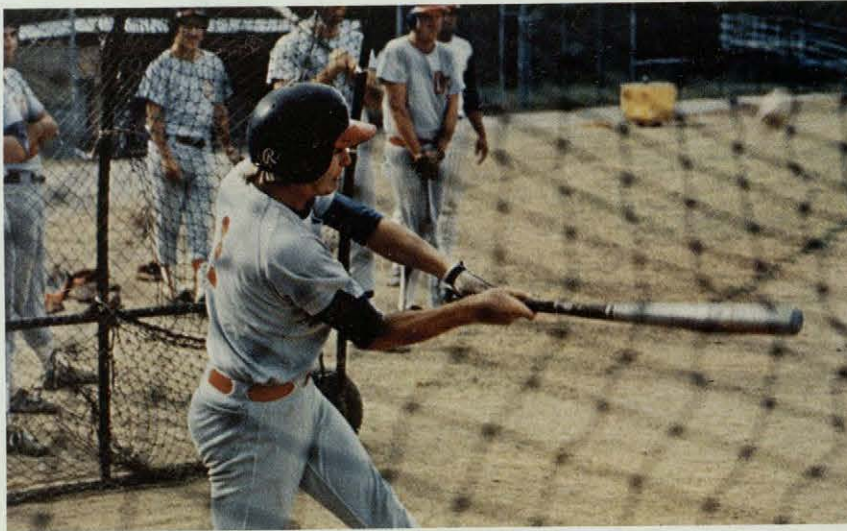
After our arrival at the stadium, Jim Tait put his men in action to give a Spider victory for the day. The air was warm, the Queen and her court were

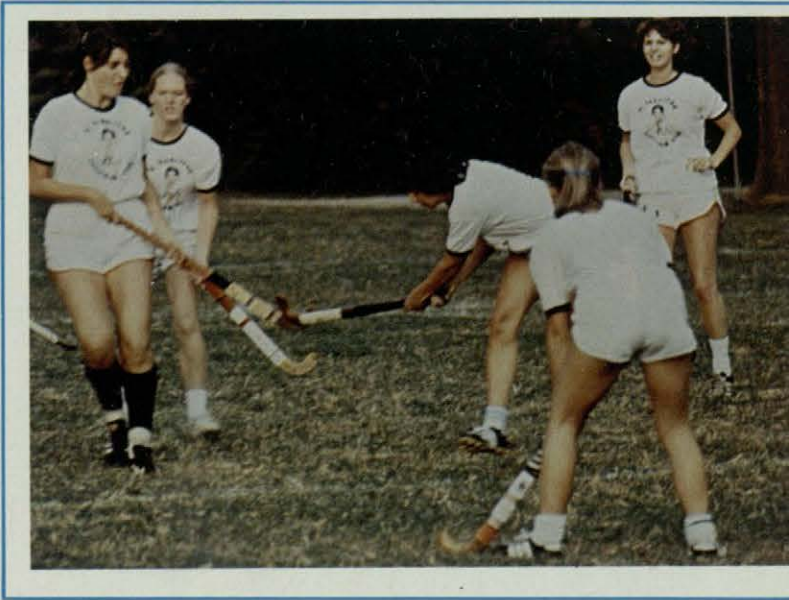
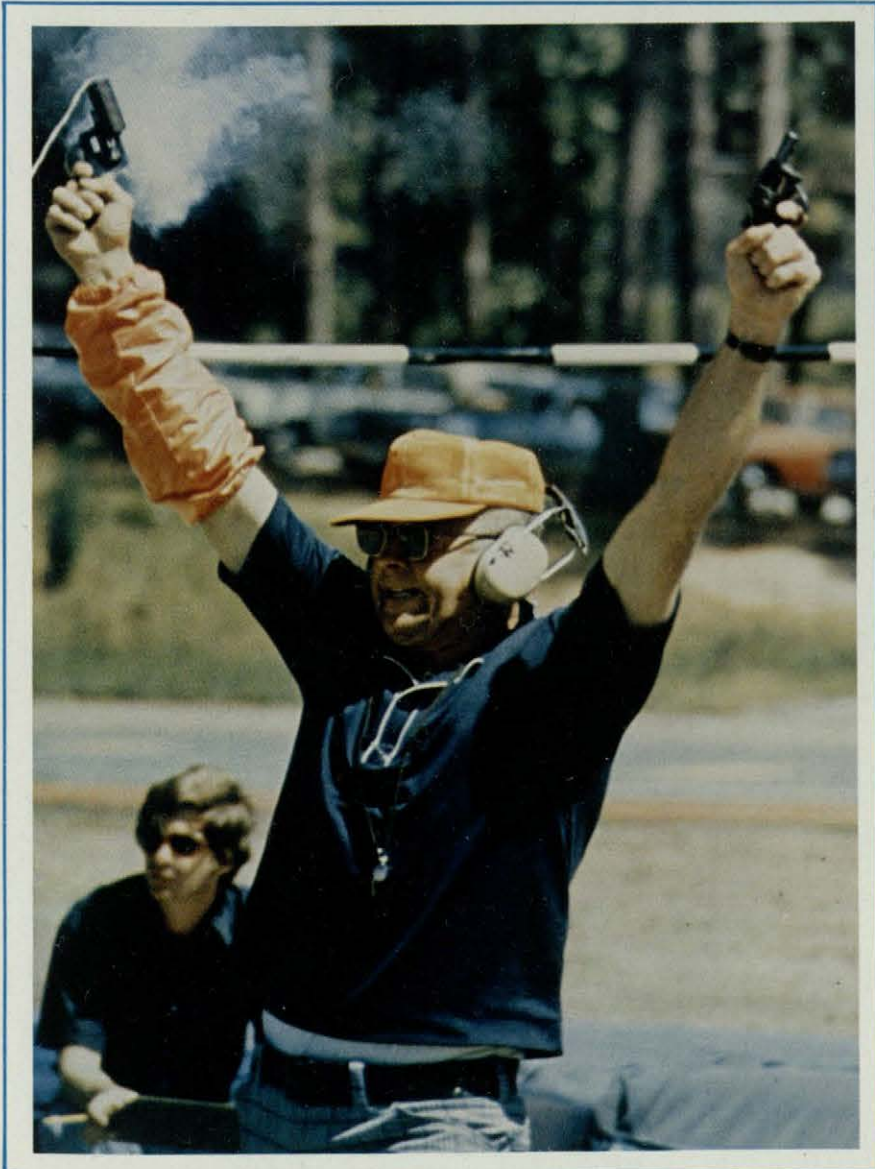


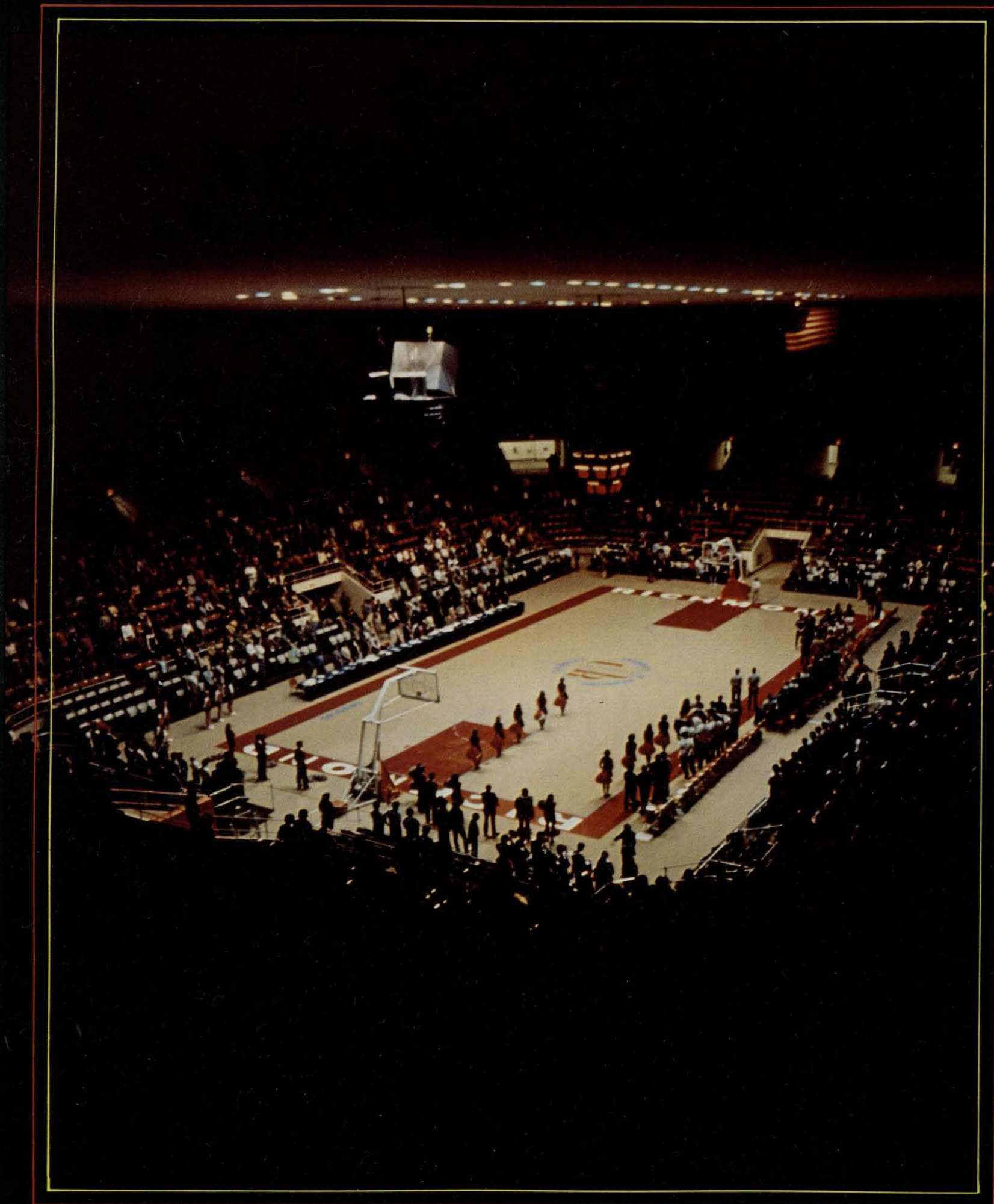

Home basketball games at the Robins Center warrant compositions to be left uncomposed, and text books to remain un-

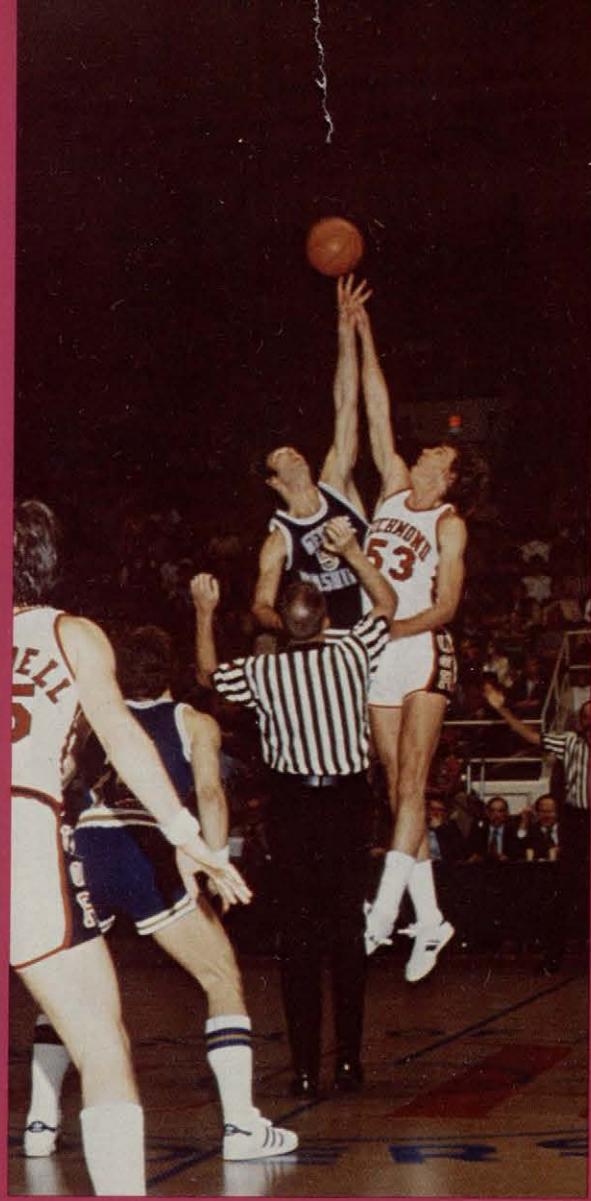

ALLEY DRIVES RICHMOND



TO CONTROVERSY



Often during college days one comes across many questions for which a stand must be taken. This year was no exception. The questions of academic freedom and freedom of speech came into light when Dr. Robert Alley, Chairman of the Religion Department, angered Baptist supporters of the university by telling a group of professed athiests that "Jesus never really claimed to be God or to be related to him." After much deliberation with the administration on the issue, Dr. Alley made a lateral move to chair the new Area studies program here at the university.

The university community united behind Dr. Alley and the question of academic freedom. The faculty demonstrated their support by drawing up a resolution upholding Dr. Alley's right to speak freely and express his own opinions. Students held a rally and circulated a petition calling for the reinstatement of Dr. Alley as head of the Religion Department to be presented to President Heilman.

Much publicity arose from this issue and as a result the university became the target for both favorable and unfavorable reactions. The urgency felt by faculty and students to defend and uphold their basic rights was the reflection of the unrest of the sixties. The Alley Issue served as a reminder to the university community to stand up and take a position when our rights and freedoms are challenged.

The Senior Year

In looking back over my four years at the University of Richmond many memories come to mind. Some are still fresh in one's mind while others have already begun to fade from memory. Freshman year seems so far away, but, then again, it seems like only yesterday when I first arrived on this campus. I remember a scared and lonely freshman who used up most of his courage just to stick it out the first day.

Lord knows he never thought he'd last four years.

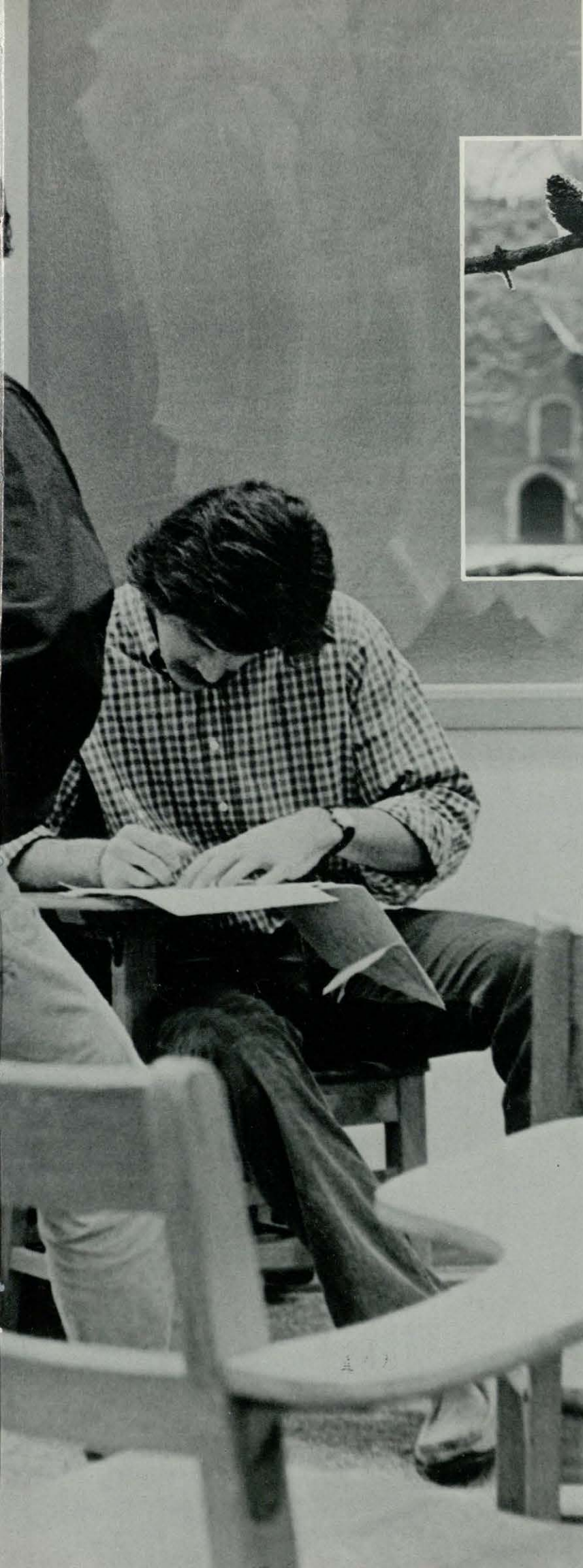
It was a struggle and now it is over for some. For most of us it has only begun. As we go on to graduate school or out to work, we know that some of life's biggest challenges and rewards still lay ahead. But we are the lucky ones. Already the names and faces of those who came in with us, but didn't make it are growing dim.

We are the lucky ones. We have been able to enjoy the good times, as well as the bad, and survive. We

The Westhampton women are different from the girls at other schools. They dress more nicely, they have more refined manners, and are in general, more sophisticated. Most of them could probably drink you under the table, too.

College romances are in a class by themselves. You realize that what you had in high school was merely infatuation. Here at college you are dealing not with childish delusions of love and misguided notions of being "grown up," but rather with truth warmth, real maturity, and sex.

When school opens in September, summer flings and hometown honeys are soon forgotten in favor of the handsome northerner from Cocheton, New York, or of that blond haired angel from Maryland. The magic of campus throws together the dairy farmer's daughter from Charlottesville, and the Dupont's executive's son from Delaware.

Going to school at U of R offers students the advantages and the nightlife of Virginia's capital city. With a population of a quarter of a million people, Richmond is the second largest city in the Commonwealth. Situated on the doorstep of Henrico County, the university is free of the crime, hard drugs, destitution, vandalism, and rape of the inner city, eight miles away. After a few days at school, providing they had the use of a car, a student could master the routes from the campus to Richmond's main arteries, and major points of interest; Broad Street, Monument Avenue, The Capital Building, and The Governor's Mansion, not to mention Regency Square, Krispy Kreme, and Bernie's Subs. As time passed, and knowledge of the city expanded, the student could wrestle such logistical problems as the best place to go for pizza — Pizza Hut or Villa?

In the evening, and of course on weekends, Richmond students could relax, and with the aid of a few beers, forget Friday's exam, at Phil's, I Dunno's, Broad Street Station, or Bogart's. Hard Times was usually good, if you could tolerate drinking alongside unwashed longhaired creeps. For bands and dancing, there was Poor Boy's and The Pass. These establishments had a lot in common, both provided a lively atmosphere, and both were glad Much More burned down.

For those who had money, Shockoe Slip was the place to spend it — quickly. Sam Millers, The Tobacco Company, and Gatsby's were home territory to the city's elite, those who didn't have to worry about getting a table, even though no reservations were accepted for dinner.

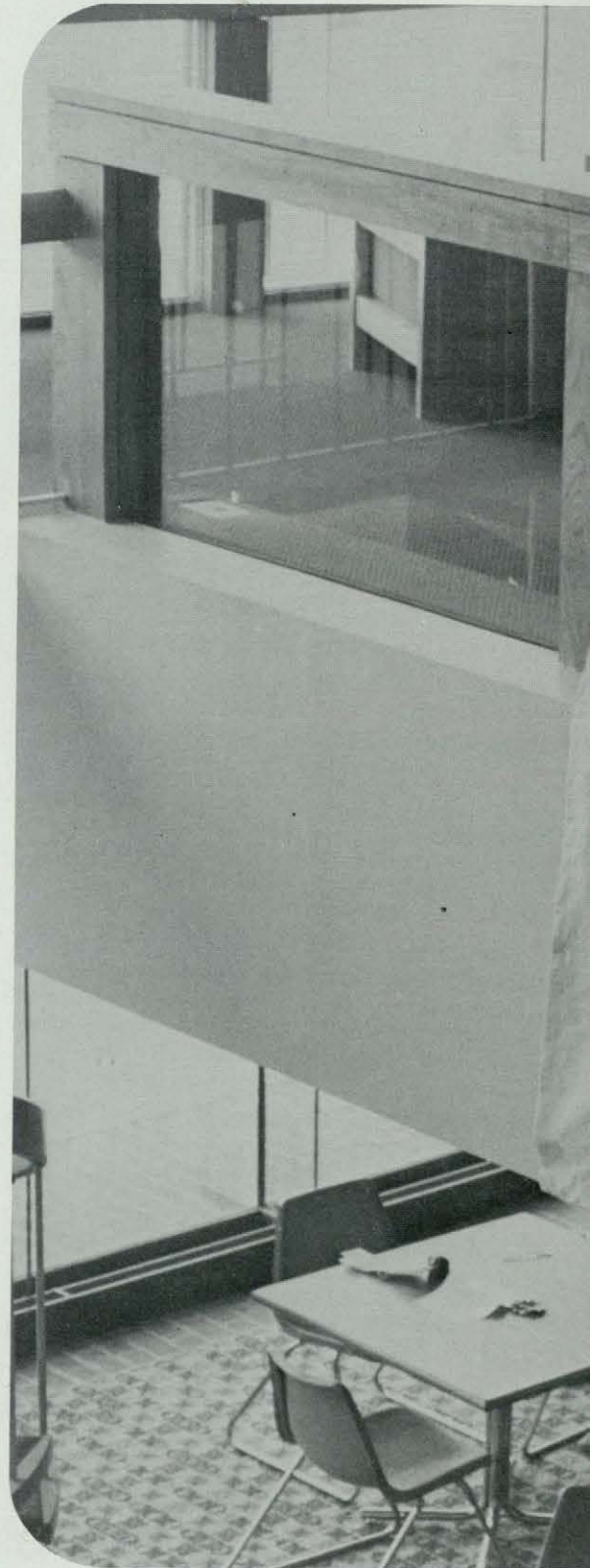
As the capital of the old confederacy, Richmond has a richness of heritage. As the capital of the tobacco industry, it also has a heritage of richness. For those from the North, the abundant Civil War commemorations inhabiting the city seem a bit excessive. (What is it again about the directions the statues on Monument Avenue face?) The legacy of the War Between the States is an intrinsic part of Richmond. It is manifested in the southern heroes statues on Monument, the names of the streets and highways, and downtown in the Museum of the Confederacy. Many confederate diehards were tormented when the Yankees won the World Series this year.

Robert E. Lee and Jefferson Davis still enjoy the statues of demi-gods in Richmond. They are as much a part of Virginia tradition as "Sic Semper Tyrannis." Few people realize however, that Mr. Davis was born in Connecticut, and Mr. Lee was raised on a farm in New Jersey.

While the majority of Richmond students are native Virginians, the university is gradually becoming more cosmopolitan, and the campus population more diverse. Classes are filled with men and women from Delaware, Tennessee, Maryland, West Virginia, New York, North Carolina, Connecticut, Florida, Pennsylvania, and, of course, New Jersey.

New Jersey contributes a generous amount of its native sons and daughters to the student community at Richmond. 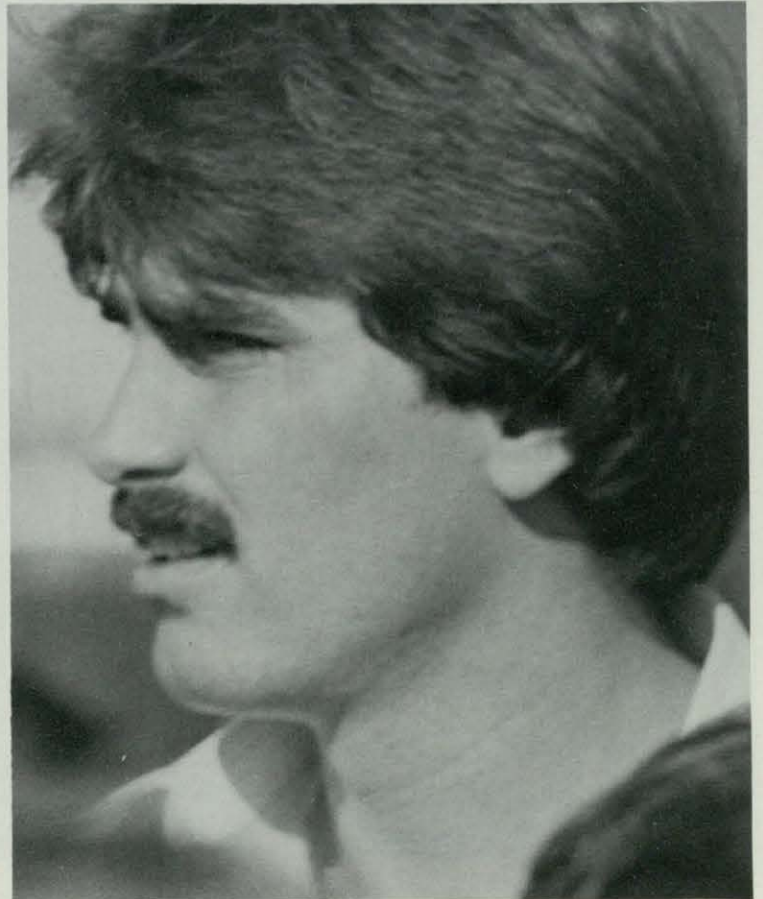
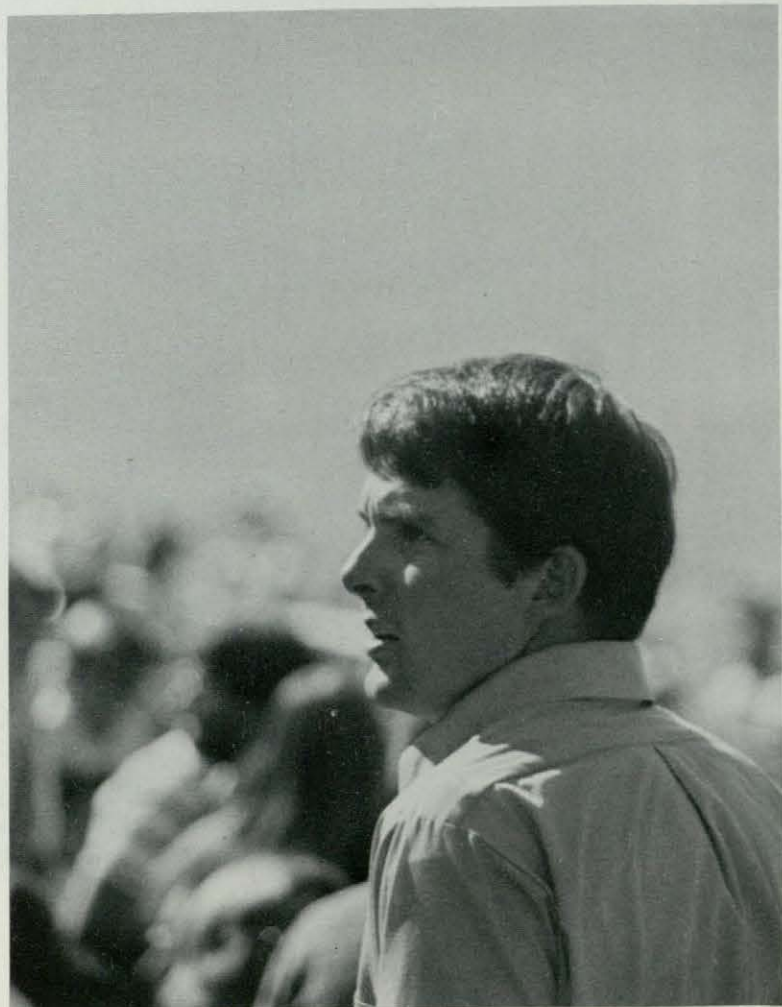




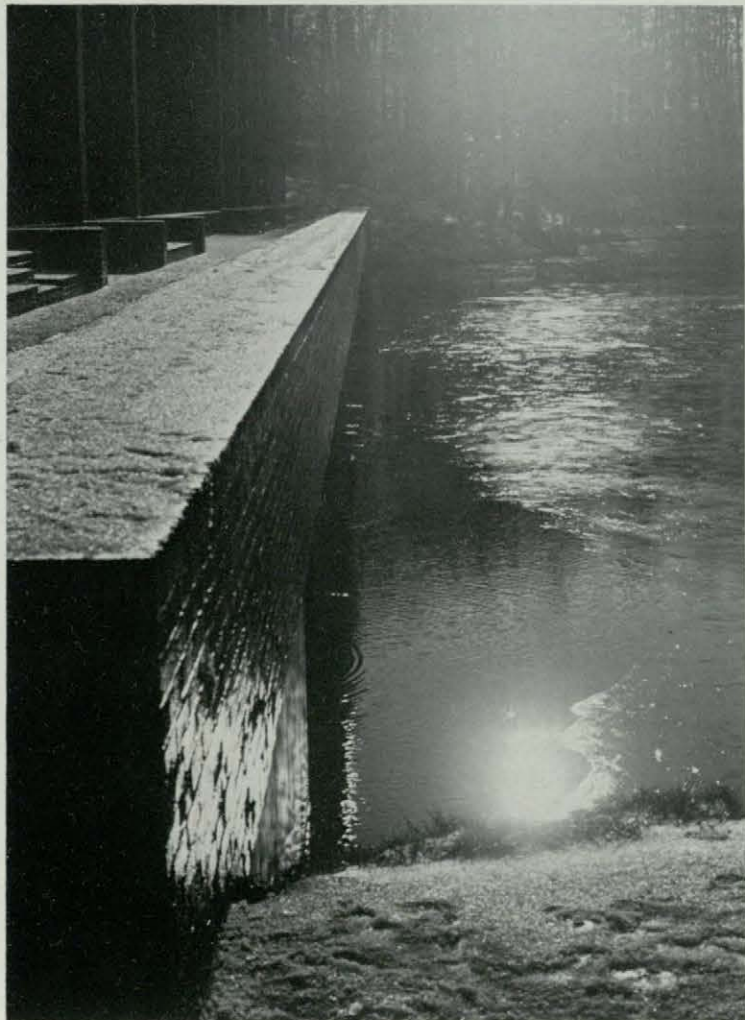
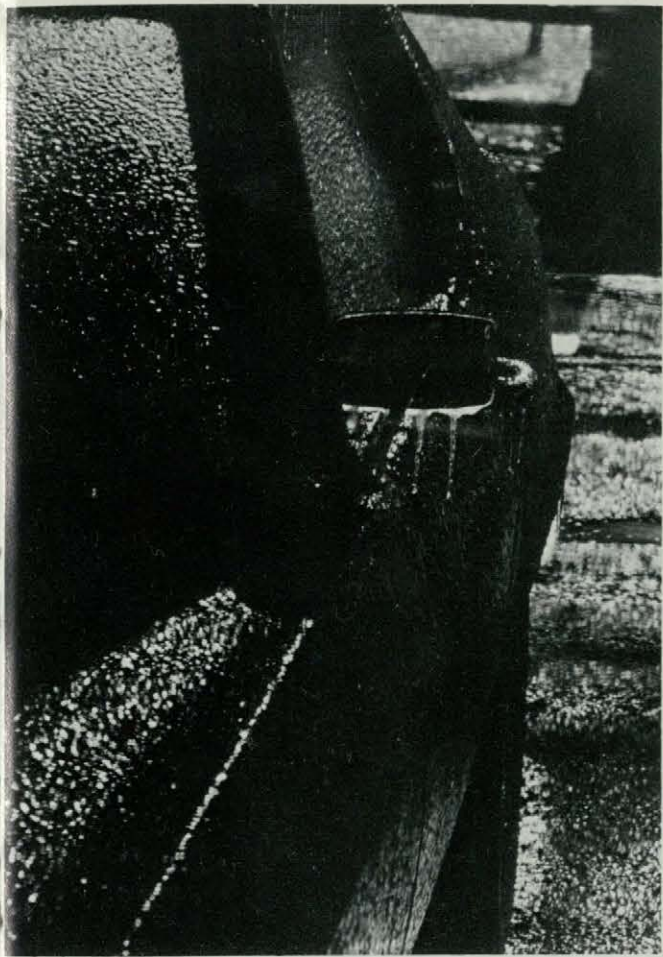














Campus Living Has Its "Ups and Downs"

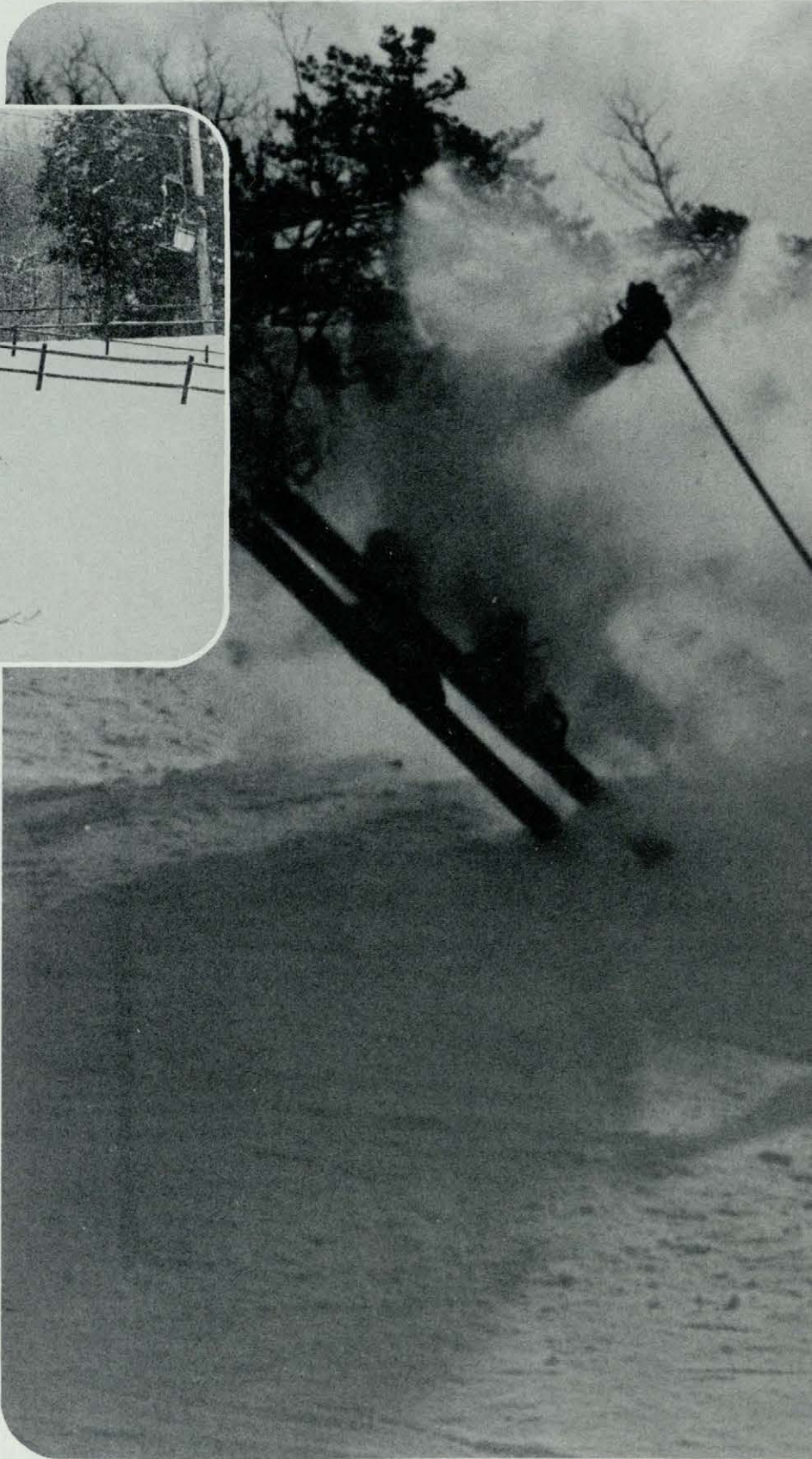

You didn't write to anyone last week anyway.

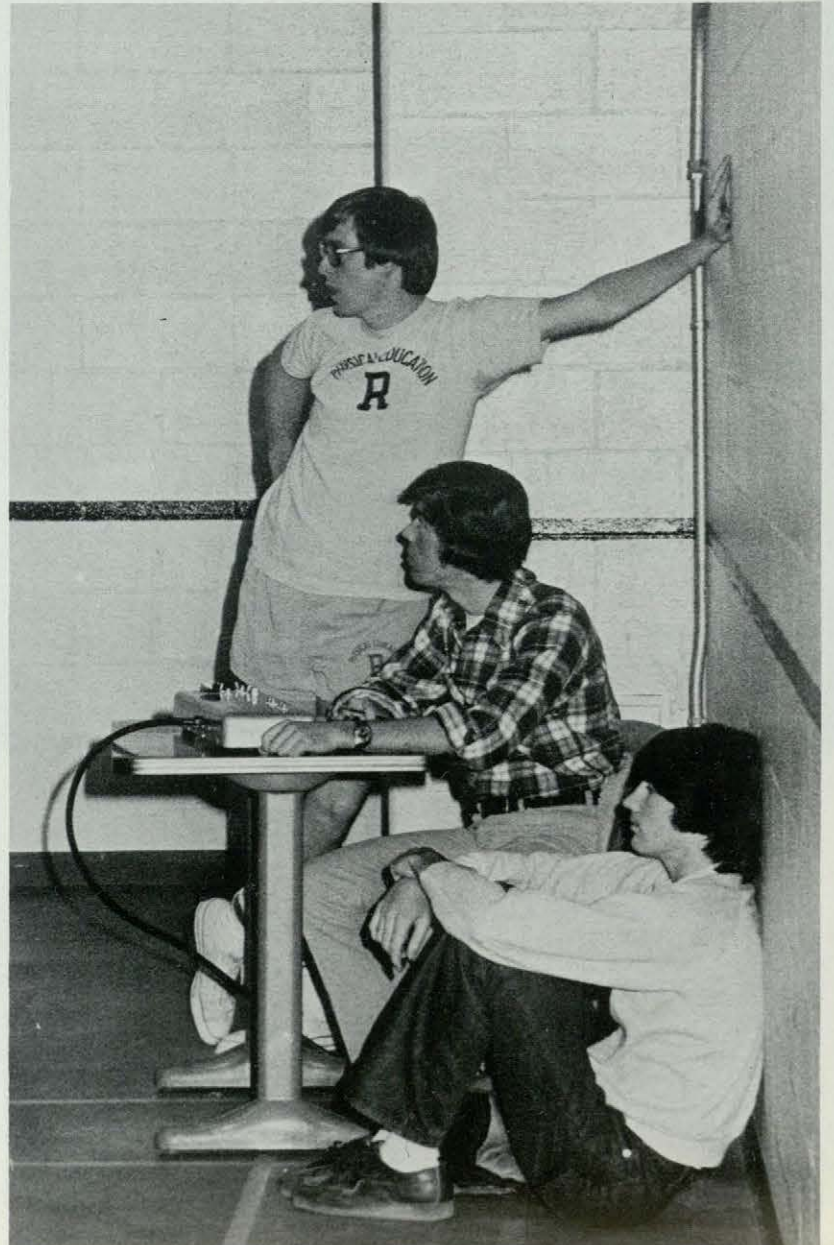
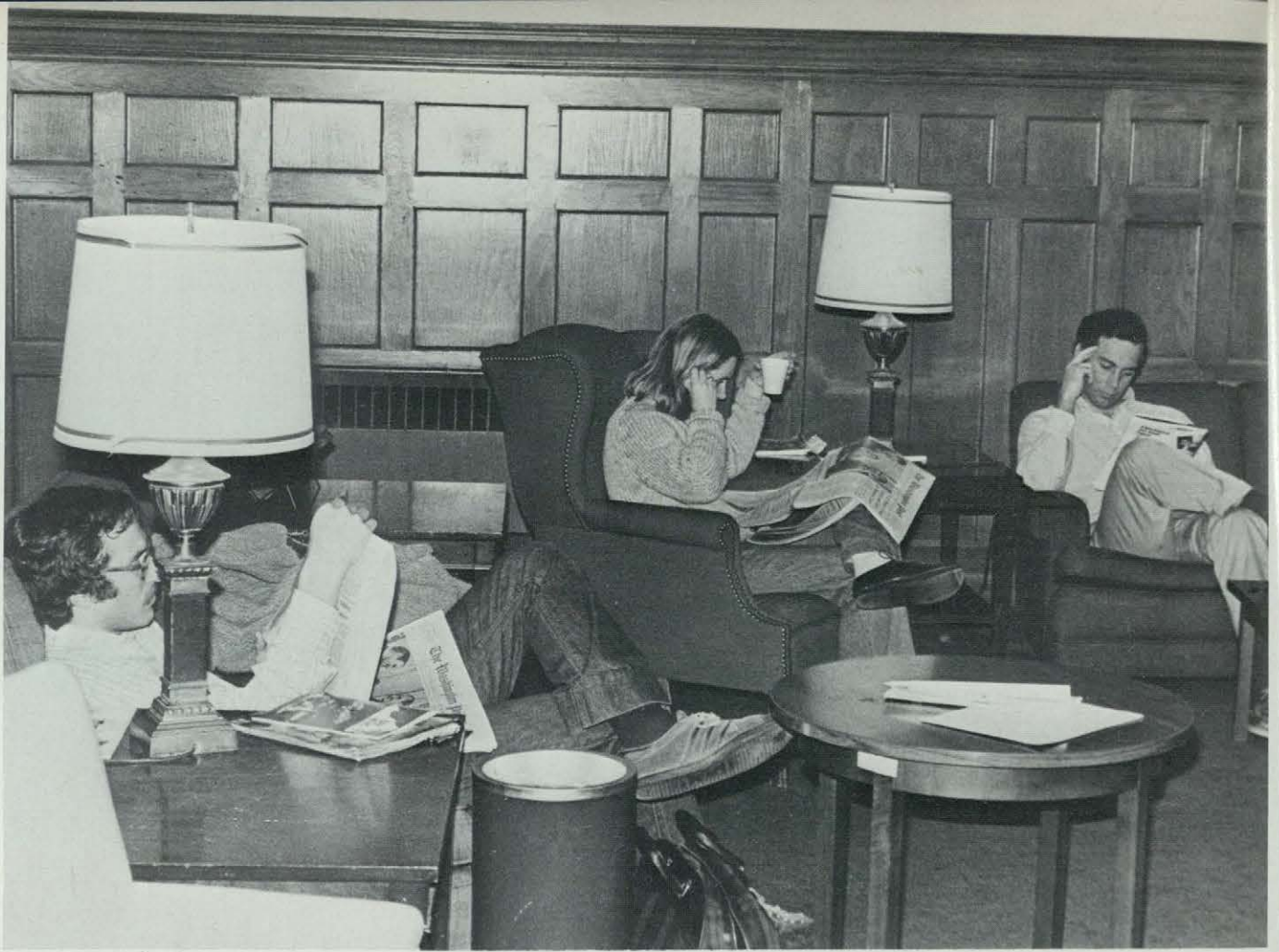

Reflections

Often times, as members of the university community, we don't have the time to always keep up with what is happening in the rest of the world, the state or even on our own campus. Due to the large amount of information that we try to keep embodied up within our minds, we are often times guilty of those two embarrassing words, "I forgot." With this in mind, the WEB staff would like to present to you our perspective of yearly affairs.

The school year '77 and '78 was to say the least eventful. Students arrived on campus in search of a dwelling only to find themselves in the infirmary waiting for permanent housing, in modular homes, or without furniture if they were in newly renovated Keller Hall.

On the National scene, the world was dominated by terrorism. Such outbreaks of terrorism swept around the world as Hanafi gunmen held 134 hostages in Washington, South Moluccans in Holland captured 53 people aboard a train, and Japanese dissenters hijacked a plane.

It was not only terrorism which had its problems. Politics had its downfall as well. Bert Lance was toppled from power as director of the Office of Management and Budget as Senate hearings scrutinized his finances. President Carter tried to get higher gas taxes, relinquish the tradition of a big family car, and proposed that the Panama Canal be controlled by Panamanians. Tongsun Park created a Koreagate scandal with accusations that he handed out \$1 million a year to influence congressmen. Indiria Gandhi was defeated at the polls, and faced charges of abuse of her position as India's prime minister. Later she announced that she was heading a new political party in India.

The Equal Rights Amendment was one of the top issues to reach the Virginia General Assembly. Not only was ERA ominent in the legislature, there was a major emphasis of it placed on the campus by the university lifestyles committee.

The most enormous event of world-wide politics was the courageous effort displayed by Anwar Sadat of Egypt. His flight from Egypt to Israel may have taken only 28 minutes to complete; however, it marked the beginning of a world dream — the dream that the friction in the Mid East would cease and that an atmosphere of peace would prevail. Even though Sadat and Premier Begin parted without agreeing to anything other than to meet again,

the 29-year old deadlock in the Middle East had been broken.

It is usually the case that politicians seem to dominate the news; however, this year individualism seemed to produce the outcome of things. Some things were good but then some were bad too. In Sports, our campus roadrunner Hillary Tuwei set a school record at almost every meet in which he competed. For the first time in our school's history a woman, Deborah Snaggs, was sent to the National Track Meet for Women in Houston, Texas. These two athletes placed our school at the top of co-ed sports in the nation. Not only did students make the news, but so did faculty members. Dr. Robert Alley was removed as the chairman of the Religion Department to a newly created department called Area Studies. This sudden change arose from area ministers who requested his dismissal from the school due to a talk that he held with members of a Unitarian church. He was quoted as saying that Jesus never really claimed to be the son of God or related to him. The issue of Academic Freedom became prevalent among faculty and students which resulted in protests demanding Alley's reinstatement to chair the Religion Department.

Speaking of religion, Anita Bryant took a face full of dessert during her campaign against homosexuals. Anita also found time to appear before the Baptists in the Robins Center here on our campus.

The year was not totally depressing. Sylvester Stallone, Rocky, took the honors as Male Star of the Year, while competing against such science fiction greats as R2D2 and C3PO. These sidekicks gave up a new art form as "Star Wars" netted more money than any other motion picture ever. Alex Haley added dignity to everyone's life with his creation, 'Roots.' All who were fortunate enough to view the final episode of Roots really wondered about where they came from. The final episode was the highest rated program in history and the book sold an outstanding five and a half million copies. Chicken George became a household name.

Other greats included Steve Cauthen who at the age of 17 took Sportsman of the Year after winning nearly 500 races and a record \$6 million in purses. Reggie Jackson hit four consecutive homers to cap the World Series victory over the Doggers. Roger Staubach led the Dallas Cowboys to win the Superbowl, and Seattle Slew become the 10th horse to sweep the jewels of Thoroughbred racing's Triple Crown. Tracy Austin became the youngest (14) ever to play at Wimbledon, and Billy Carter found himself





competing with Amy and Miss Lilliam for publicity, but crowded them out with his blitz for a new beer. Amy's chainsaw for Christmas just couldn't compete with Billy's abundance of intelligence. George Willig climbed the 1,350 foot South Tower of Manhattan's World Trade Center only later to be sued \$1.10 — a penny a floor, for "willfully and wrongfully" climbing the building. While mentioning bills, Jackie Onassis received quite a few but in a different sense. Her's was \$26 million, the share of a settlement with Christina Onassis. U or R received an anonymous gift of \$2 million for a new dorm, while Elizabeth Taylor received a silo as a wedding present from her sixth husband, John Warner, a gentleman farmer campaigning for the U.S. Senate. Richard Nixon also made a few cool million for making perfectly clear his opinion of Watergate with David Frost. Farrah Fawcett-Majors also had a winning racket until she flew from Charlie's Angels. Her pop poster was the biggest seller ever (more than six million).

The years '77-'78 took from us a lot of famous people. During the summer, Americans were shocked that the King of Rock 'n Roll Elvis Presley died. At the age of 42, some 80,000 grief-stricken fans massed outside his mansion. Others who died included Joan Crawford, Ethel Waters, Andy Devine, Mary Ford, Sebastian Cabot, Freddie Prinze, Groucho Marx, Guy Lombardo, Charlie Chaplin, Peter Finch, Leopold Stokowski, Vladimir Nabov, and Big Crosby, 73, whose 850 records sold more than 300 million copies, including the all time best seller "White Christmas." On campus the student body was in wonderment once the news came that Lt. Albert B. Cole, III had died. He died leaving behind him an enormous amount of respect from the students, faculty, and administration of this University. It is not the same going in on Friday before two o'clock to cash a check in the payments office without Mrs. Chewing politely helping us handle our finances. She too will live long in the hearts of Richmonders. As a new year came in, an old but respected face went out. Senator Hubert Humphrey, D-Minn and once Vice President of the United States died of inoperable cancer. His seat in the Senate was only to be replaced by his wife, Muriel. The world of comics lost Li'l Abner, when creator Al Capp, 68 retired due to poor health. The Dogpatch crowd has performed for the last time in 43 years. More sadness arose when Tom Seavor of the Mets was traded to Cincinnati. This "Tom Terrific" had previously pitched the Big Apple into two World Series. Also the incomparable Pele said Ole to his team

after twenty-one years. Pele was the most glorious and the highest paid team athlete of his time.

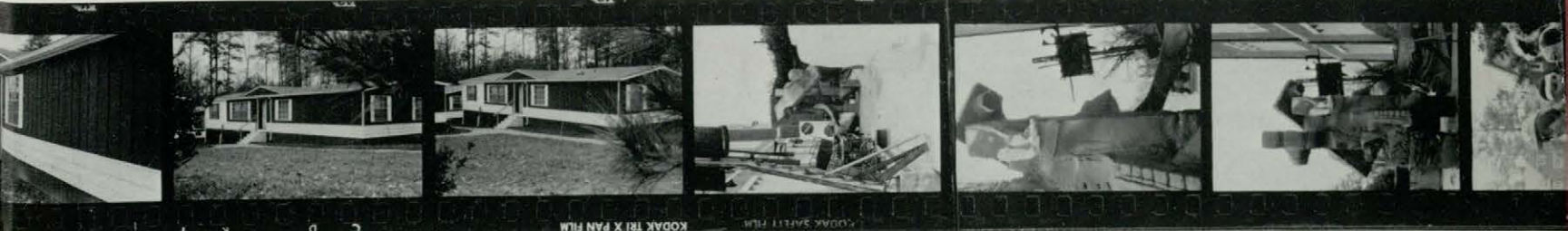
In the world of aviation, the Concorde make its first landing at Richmond's Byrd International Airport and The Enterprise, Nasar's new bird for outer space, prepared for its scheduled lift off in 1979. It was the worst disaster in aviation history, with 584 killed when a KLM Royal Dutch Airlines jet smashed into a Pan An World Airlines plane at Tenerife on the Canary Islands.

For the more cheerful side of life, two women, Betty Williams and Mairead Corrigan, won the Nobel Peace Prize for their crusade to bring peace to Northern Ireland. Also, reports conclude that more than 1,657 prisoners of conscience were freed during 1977 from the political jails and torture chambers of the world due to the relentless perservance of Amnesty International. The world's attention finally focused on human rights. In the U.S., President Carter made it evident from his first days in office that the issue of human rights would be a vital part of his whole foreign policy.

The Supreme Court had a busy year as well as everyone else. Their major business included the barring of Medicaid funds for elective abortions, the denial of Richard Nixon's bid for control of his presidential papers and tapes, and the banning of capital punishment for rape. We still anxiously awaited the Bakke civil rights case, involving reverse discrimination.

With this at hand, the issues of the student are close at heart. The University of Richmond didn't produce anymore female Roades Scholars; nevertheless, the quality of our education seemed to grow greater. The over all opinion of the slogan "THE Univeristy in Virginia" was attacked; however, those who did so realized that this university was certainly on its way to become one of the best private schools in the country. If this was not to be seen through the eyes of outsiders, it was certainly recognized by the school as a whole. This is not to say that everything was rosey and peachy cream. Like other years, tuition went up \$300 and more people were enrolled. The Alley situation left a bad scare on this university; nevertheless, it is correct to say that we learned our lesson, and it will not happen again.

Perhaps, the most important thing that happened at U of R, is that the students' love for their school and its ideals did not decline. The school provided the security similar to our homes. "We are Spider born and Spider bred. And when we die, we'll be Spider dead." What better way to end our year. We made it!
