## From the Editors:

The *Review* this year has made a conscious effort to move its publication date for the Fall issue substantially closer to the opening of classes here at the law school for the Fall session. Having met with some success, the Fall issue is available approximately a month earlier this year than last, and the proposed publication date for the Spring issue reflects a similar improvement. Our modest goal, of course, is to publish a Fall and Spring issue in fact, rather than in name only.

The recent flood of applications for enrollment at T. C. Williams and the current construction of new office, classroom and library facilities forecast unprecedented future growth possibilities in both the quantity and quality of students at the law school. The *Review* can now only speculate upon its own future in the wake of such developments, but we dream of a larger staff and the publication of more issues during the year.

There is a growing awareness here at the law school and in the legal community at large that we must be professionally concerned with problems of national scope, no matter how insulated we feel that we are or should be from their consequences.
