

Pianist

Richard Becker, Associate Professor of Music at University of Richmond and Head of Piano, is a piano recitalist, composer, chamber musician and poet who has performed at over sixty colleges and at venues such as Alice Tully Hall, Town Hall, the Library of Congress, the National Gallery, the French Embassy (Wash., D.C.), at Cité Internationale des Arts, and Salle Cortot, Paris. His playing has been broadcast on NPR, Voice of America, WNYC, and WETA, and WGMS. His performance on a CRI CD of piano works by the acclaimed Ameri-



can composer David Chaitkin is forthcoming.

Becker holds degrees from the University of Rochester's Eastman School of Music where he studied piano with Cecile Staub Genhart and from Boston University where for four years he was assistant to one of Artur Schnabel's leading exponents, Leonard Shure. Additional piano studies were with Rudolph Serkin during Becker's residency at the Serkin's Institute for Young Performing Musicians, with Adele Marcus in New York, and most recently with French repertoire specialists Roy Howat, Gail Delente, and Noel Lee. His performances at the 1996 French Piano Institute, held that season at the famed l'École Normal de Musique de Paris, earned Richard Becker a First Prize and subsequent recital appearance at the French Embassy in Washington, D.C.

Composer

A recipient of "Meet the Composer" grants, a fellow at the MacDowell Colony, and a Nominee for a Music Award by the American Academy of Arts and Letters, Becker has composed music that has been commissioned and performed by the Peabody Piano Trio, cellist James Wilson and pianist Joanne Kong, pianist Nancy Burton Garrett, by the Richmond Symphony Woodwind Quintet, the Richmond Symphony Woodwind Trio, Roxbury Players, Rochester, N.Y.'s Hillel Society, and University of Richmond's Schola Cantorum among others at such venues as Tanglewood Music Festival, Peabody Conservatory, National Gallery of Art, Boston's Gardner Museum, Boston University School of the Arts, James Madison University, University of Texas, Williams College, Bennington College, l'École Nor-

mal du Musique, Cité Internationale des Arts of Paris, France, the Eastman School of Music, and frequently at the University of Richmond. The world premiere of his single movement work for piano and cello, Crossing Pont Marie (1997-99), has been hailed as "AN ABSOLUTE TRIUMPH." Richmond Times Dispatch (2000).

Also a chamber performer, Richard Becker has appeared at such venues as Carnegie Hall, 92nd St. Y, Washington University of St. Louis, Brattleboro Music Center, Carpenter Center, and at Harvard University and Williams College. Some of the artists with whom he has collaborated are the Shanghai Quartet, Richmond Sinfonia, Judith Serkin, vocalists Kathy Koan, Nan Nall, and Suzanne Stevens, violinists, Phil Lewis and with Wei Gang Li, Hong Gang Li of the Shanghai Quartet, with violist, Zheng Wang, and cellists James Wilson and Andor Toth Jr.
