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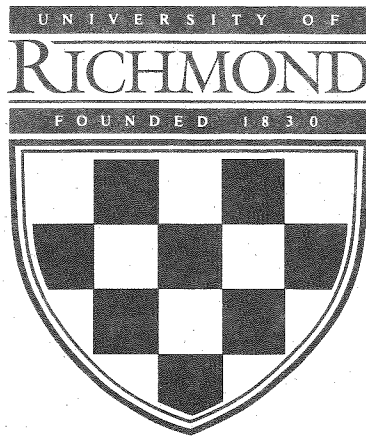

ABOUT THE DIRECTORS

Born in North Dakota but growing up in Iowa, **Gene Anderson** received his B.A. in music from Luther College in Decorah, Iowa, and his M.A. in woodwind performance and Ph.D. in music theory from the University of Iowa. After teaching for several years in Iowa public schools, he taught woodwinds and directed the jazz ensemble at Winona State University in Winona, Minn., and served as department chair and directed the Wind Ensemble at Monmouth College in Monmouth, Ill. before coming to the University of Richmond in 1982 as Director of Bands and instructor in music theory.



Michael Davison joined the University of Richmond music faculty in 1986 as Director of Jazz Bands and instructor of music education. Originally from Whitewater, Wisc., he has an M.A. in music education from the Eastman School of Music and a D.M.A. in trumpet performance from the University of Wisconsin in Madison. Dr. Davison is active as a brass clinician and soloist in classical music and jazz throughout the Richmond and Washington, D.C. area.
