Roussel - "Rossignol, mon mignon"

Nightingale, my sweet, who in this willow, goes alone from branch to branch at your will, and sings, to my envy, as I wish that I could sing, That which must always be in the mouth I have.

We sigh together; your sweet voice tries to ring the goodwill of one who so loves you, and I, mournful, I will lament the beauty, that sours the wounds in my heart.

However, Nightingale, we differ at a point, it's that you are loved, and I am not, even though we both have similar music.

Because you bend your love with the sweet sounds of your songs, but my own love scorns my songs, so as not to hear them, blocks the sound.
