The Spring Winds Trio was initially formed in the spring of 1983, after a particularly hard winter, by the principal players of the Licking County Symphony. The Licking County Symphony is the College Community Orchestra associated with Denison University in Granville, Ohio.

With the Trio as guest artists are William Baker, Professor in the School of Music at the Ohio State University, and his wife, Vivian Baker. Mr. Baker is principal oboe of the Pro Musica Chamber Orchestra of Columbus and a founding member of the Lyric Wind Quintet. Mrs. Baker, hornist, performs with the Women's Music Club Symphony Orchestra and the Scioto Brass Quintet. She is an instrumental music specialist with Stanton's Sheet Music of Columbus, Ohio.
