MONTICELLO TRIO

The *MONTICELLO TRIO* is Trio-in-Residence at the University of Virginia. Their many concert appearances have included performances in New York, Toronto, Portland, St. Louis, Salt Lake City, at the Phillips Collection in Washington D.C., the Gardiner Museum in Boston and throughout Virginia. The trio has also been heard on National Public Radio and on WQXR's "The Listening Room."

In addition to performing an extensive standard repertoire, the *MONTICELLO TRIO* has commissioned new works from Martin Bresnick, Judith Shatin-Allen and Barbara Kolb. The trio has been awarded grants from the National Endowment for the Arts and they have been chosen to be Ensemble-in-Residence for the Banff Centre for the Arts for the summer of 1989.

Each member of the trio serves as artist-faculty for the McIntyre Department at the University of Virginia.

Mark Rush is a graduate of Yale University and has studied with Szymon Goldberg and Itzhak Perlman. Since making his orchestral debut at the age of 13, he has soloed with orchestras in the United States including the New Mexico and Denver Symphonies. As a Fulbright scholar, he spent a year in Brussels working with the late Belgian violinist Arthur Grumiaux.

Cellist *Mathias Wexler* is a graduate of Oberlin and Yale where he studied with Aldo Parisot and Andor Toth, Jr. He has received fellowships from Tanglewood, Aspen, and the Yale Music Festival. As a chamber musician and recitalist, he has appeared in New York, Boston, Cleveland, Toronto, Montreal, Banff and Aspen.

Tannis Gibson, pianist, holds a Master of Music degree from the Juilliard School. Her teachers have included William Moore and the late Sasha Gorodnitzki. She has performed at the Marin Music Fest in San Francisco and has concertized as a soloist and chamber musician in the United States, Canada and Europe. Ms. Gibson was recently invited to perform at the Canadian Cultural Center in Paris.
