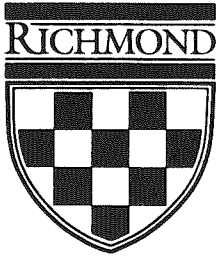

Mathias Wexler, cellist with the Monticello Trio, holds a B.M. from the Oberlin Conservatory and an M.M. from Yale University. Mr. Wexler has studied with Andor Toth, Jr. and Aldo Parisot, and he has coached chamber music with members of the Guarneri and Juilliard Quartets. With the Monticello Trio, he has toured extensively throughout the U.S., including appearances in New York, Boston, St. Louis, Salt Lake City, and San Francisco. While studying at the Banff School for the Arts, he formed the Norway String Quartet and later became cellist with the Ariel Trio. He has recorded on the Delos label and for CRI Records.

Tannis Gibson, Canadian pianist, holds an M.M. from the Juilliard School and completed advanced studies in music at the Banff School for the Arts in Canada. Her teachers include Sascha Gorodnitzki and Eduardo del Pueyo, and she has coached chamber music with Menachem Pressler and Gyorgy Sebok. In addition to extensive touring throughout the United States and Canada as pianist with the Monticello Trio, Ms. Gibson has recently appeared at Richmond's International Festival, the Marin Music Fest in San Francisco, and the Canadian Cultural Center in Paris.

Franciska Koscielny, violinist, is presently on the applied music faculty at the University of Virginia.
