Nancy Burton Garrett is a Professor (piano) at the University of Texas at Austin. She received the Bachelor's degree and the Performance Certificate from the Eastman School of Music where she studied with Cecile Genhart, and she holds the Master's degree in performance from the University of Texas under Dalies Frantz. She has also studied at the Santa Cecilia Conservatory in Rome, Italy and the Royal Academy of Music in London, England. In addition to Genhart and Frantz her teachers include Leonard Shure, Charles Rosen, Silvio Scionti, and Ilona Kabos.

Mrs. Garrett was the 1962 first place winner of the G. B. Dealey Competition and a 1962-63 Fulbright Scholar. She has performed throughout the United States and in Europe, Mexico, and Taiwan, and has appeared as soloist with orchestras under such conductors as Walter Hendl, Donald Johanos, Nanse Geum and Walter Ducloux.
