John Dowland (1562-1626) DAVID and GINGER HILDEBRAND began performing professionally in Annapolis, Maryland in 1980. Now appearing throughout an eight-state region, their current specialty is the music of the Colonial Chesapeake performed in costume using reproductions of period instruments. They focus in particular on the social and cultural context of music-making before the Revolution.

Both David and Ginger received Bachelor's degrees from Dickinson College, and Ginger holds an M.A. in classical guitar performance from the Peabody Conservatory. David's Master's in Musicology is from George Washington University, and he is currently a PhD candidate at Catholic University in Washington, D.C. While Ginger teaches guitar privately and on the faculties of Hood College and The Anne Arundel Community College, David has published and lectured on colonial musical life at historical societies, universities, and for the Sonneck Society and American Musicological Society.

They have appeared on radio and television, and they have also recorded on their own label as well as for Silver, Burdett and Ginn. Copies of their recording Out On A Limb (on LP and cassette) will be available after the concert.
