Nominated three times for a Pulitzer Prize, Samuel Adler is currently professor of composition at the Eastman School of Music of the University of Rochester. The composer has published over 100 works including five symphonies, four operas, chamber works and sacred and secular choral works. Adler has received commissions from the Library of Congress and the National Endowment for the Arts, and his works have been performed by major symphonies including the New York Philharmonic and the Chicago Symphony.
