Spirituals and Folksongs, variously arranged, sung by the University Choir under the direction of graduate student Anne Oglesby.

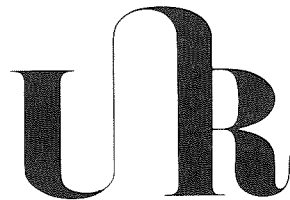
