The University Choir has embarked on one of its most ambitious seasons to date.

After performing J. S. Bach's *Mass in B Minor* last spring in the Cannon Chapel, the choir is again preparing to present this difficult work. Under the baton of Neville Marriner, world renowned British conductor of the Orchestra of the Academy of St.-Martin-in-the-Fields, the choir will participate in the St. Moritz Music Festival in Switzerland during June, 1977. The festival will be preceded by a seven-day singing tour of Central Europe.

In addition to the European Tour, the Choir will be performing their Annual Spring Concert on April 17. Dr. Claudia Stevens will be preparing and conducting the Choir for this concert as well as the European Tour and the Virginia Tour (May 10-15) which is being organized in conjunction with the Alumni Development Office.
