Program Note: Music by University of Richmond composers

F. Flaxington Marker was chairman of the music department from its beginning in 1916 until his retirement in 1926. His late Victorian style at times recalls Sir Arthur Sullivan's serious works. His setting of Abide with Me was published in 1914. Richmonder Edwin C. Robertson, UR 1962, was interim choral director there in 1968-9. He now teaches at the University of Montevallo, Alabama. Golden Slumbers and Sing My Fair Love were published in 1985. Hilton Ruffy taught at the university from 1946 until his death in 1974. British and American folksong was the basis of his conservative style. The Friendly Beasts was composed for the University Choir's

1957 Christmas Concert. Steven Errante, who joined the UK music faculty in 1982, holds degrees from the University of Michigan and Juilliard. He teaches theory, conducting and composition, and conducts the University Orchestra. Psalm 46 was composed on commission for a church choir in Lansing, Michigan. Ron Barnett will graduate from the university in 1983. His home is in Richmond, where he is a church organist and jazz pianist. The Heavens Declare is one of a series of settings of common hymn texts.
